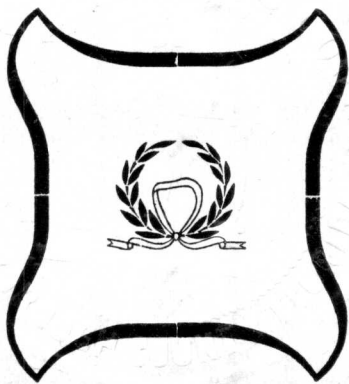
To any Minister of the Gospel or any Officer Legally Authorized to Solemnize the Rite of Matrimony:
