velopment of the cigar interest of the United States. Almost every body, both in Europe and this country, is now familiar with the history and acknowledged merits of Key West Havana cigars, and the general diffusion of this knowledge is in a large measure due to the persistent efforts of this firm to secure for them by reason of their intrinsic excellence an enduring national reputation. In conjunction with a few other emulous collaborators in the same field of enterprise, they have succeeded in building up a vast trade in these cigars, and in acquiring for them an appreciation as thorough, and, at the same time, as extended as that once only enjoyed by those produced in the city of Havana, and it would hardly be deemed an exaggeration by those conversant with the facts, both with respect to their growing popularity, and their consequent influence upon the importing trade, to say that they are likely ultimately to supersede imported cigars altogether. It will be, we doubt not, readily conceded that it is to the achievements of the Key West manufacturers, and to this firm especially, combined with the skill, enterprise and devotion exhibited within the past few years by our noted cigar manufacturers in other parts of the country, that we are indebted for the comparatively great popularity and corresponding increase in the production and consumption of domestic cigars. They have succeeded in dissipating the prejudice formerly existing against cigars made in the United States, and in eliciting the universal admission of consumers everywhere, that in no part of the world are more desirable cigars made than here. In the work thus accomplished, the firm of which we are speaking have borne a conspicuous part. Animated by uncommon pride, as well as zeal, in their pursuit, they seem to have made the business of cigar making a work in the prosecution of which perfection was the ultimate aim, as much so as in any of the higher realms of art, and their productions are, consequently, of an exceedingly attractive character, finer ones probably never having been placed upon the markets of the world. Seidenberg & Co. at 84 and 86 Reade Street, New York, where the cigars manufactured in the *La Rosa Española* manufactory are supplied to the wholesale and jobbing trade, is well known to business men, and constitutes one of the attractive features of that portion of our city.

#### MINOR EDITORIALS AND NEWS ITEMS.

**REVENUE MATTERS.**—An important paper received from the Bureau of Internal Revenue goes over for want of space, to our next issue.

**RETURNED.**—Our Boston correspondent, Mr. Emory Bemis, Jr., has returned from Havana, whither he went on business for himself. He confirms previous reports published in *THE LEAF* respecting leaf tobacco.

**STOCKS AT HAMBURG.**—The *Deutsch Tabak Zeitung*, of January 12, says:—Stocks of leaf tobacco in first hands at Hamburg are nearly all sold, and transactions made for some time past were on account of goods to arrive.

**ADVERTISING FAVORS.**—To accommodate our advertising friends we are again compelled to ask the indulgence of our readers, on whose space we are seriously trenching. As promptly as possible we shall make such arrangements as will do justice to both parties.

**D. S. MOORE,** for many years connected with the eminent house of Bulkley & Moore, tobacco commission merchants, this city, has engaged in business on his own account at 62 Water Street, and, as formerly, will devote his attention to the sale on commission of manufactured tobacco.

**SIGNS OF BUSINESS.**—*Henderson News.*—On Tuesday last there were near 500 loads of tobacco standing upon our streets—the largest number of wagons ever known enter our city in one day. Out of about 500, all were unloaded but 35 who returned home with their crop—refusing to accept the price offered for the weed.

**INDEPENDENT.**—The Huntsville (Mo.) tobacco buyers started out Monday. They offered prices ranging from \$2.50 to \$5 per hundred, but found no takers. When they got back to Huntsville, and were relating their experience, one of them took occasion to remark:—"These Randolph farmers are the most d-d independent set of cusses I ever saw outside of Kentucky."

**SEIZURE OF SMUGGLED TOBACCO.**—Information has reached the internal revenue office of the capture of 179 boxes of tobacco by Collector Reed of the Fifth Virginia District. The capture was made at Max Meadows Station, and was from North Carolina. Ten other wagon loads of illicit tobacco were on the way to the same point, but the owners heard of the capture and returned.

**DEATH OF HENRY HOFFMANN.**—We sincerely regret having to announce the recent death of Mr. Henry Hoffmann, of the late firm of Henry Hoffmann & Co., importers of London Washing Crystal and exporters of leaf tobacco, etc., 185 Duane Street, this city. The deceased was the New York buyer for the house of J. A. Hoffmann & Co., London (Eng.). His successors are D. I. Hoffmann and Frank Hatch, who continue the business as formerly. Mr. Henry Hoffmann was a genial, pleasant gentleman, and left many warm friends to mourn his loss.

**RETIRED.**—Mr. Gustav Guth, the prominent and widely known cigar manufacturer of 53 German Street, Baltimore, has retired from business, having acquired a competency in the pursuit which he honored by his connection, and with which he was for many years associated. Mr. Guth made a specialty of the production of fine cigars, and had an extensive trade in the Southern States. His successor is Mr. Neukirch, a gentleman long identified in various capacities with Mr. Guth's house, and, therefore, well qualified to take the

place of his eminent predecessor. Our best wishes attend the old and new proprietor.

#### Exchange Market News.

**Marietta (Pa.) Times, February 3.**—Mr. — last week sold all of his tobacco for 20 and 5 cents per pound. Mr. —, of lower Marietta, sold all of his tobacco for 20 and 8. H. — sold one acre of tobacco at 20, 10 and 5 cents per pound. The total weight of the product of this acre was 2,231 pounds. Mr. R. — thinks there are few who can beat this. He also had two more acres for which he got 20 cents for the best and 5 for fillers. L. — W. — sold two acres for 20, 10 and 5 cents per pound.

**Edgerton (Wis.) Independent, February 2.**—Since our last issue we have had a general thaw, which has put a part of the tobacco in case, but the moisture was not great enough to put all the tobacco in the right condition. All that did get in case has been taken down and will be stripped as fast as can be handled. But little tobacco is changing hands, though buyers are picking up a few crops, so we are informed, but we have not learned the particulars. We have picked up a few sales which are as follows:—53 cases 1875, 6c; 1875 crop, 5c; 11 cases 1875, 2@5c; 1876 crop, 5½c; 1876 crop, 6c; 49 cases 1874-5 crop, 2@4c. The shipments are very light, 24 cases being shipped to St. Louis and 44 cases to New York.

#### Missouri Tobacco Inspection.

**ST. LOUIS, MO., January 20, 1877.**  
**EDITOR TOBACCO LEAF.**—Please find inclosed an account of our meeting held on the evening of the 19th inst. The Tobacco Association has, after canvassing the matter, agreed on a memorial to our State Legislature, asking the repeal of all State laws in relation to the inspection of leaf tobacco in Missouri. The Grange Executive Committee has joined us and recommends the repeal as we desire.

#### REPORT OF MEETING.

An important meeting was held at the Laclede Hotel last night, composed of a committee of the St. Louis Tobacco Association and the Executive Committee of the State Grange of Missouri. The Tobacco Association was represented by the following members:—Jas. A. Gregory, Chairman; A. Meier, Jr., W. M. Ladd, Jno. N. Booth, M. D., Hetzel, Wm. M. Price, T. T. Settle, Lewis J. Clark, C. R. Dormitzer and I. Will Boyd. The State Grange was represented by the following members, who compose the executive committees of the Grange. Judge R. Q. Roache, California, Mo., Chairman; I. C. Gill, Secretary; Dr. H. B. Hamilton, Ray County; W. C. Downing, Pike County; I. P. Bibb, Randolph County; J. S. Parsons, Saline County. There were also present: Wm. M. Price, John N. Booth, Craig Alexander, Edward Berry, Christian Peper, Col. J. V. Paramore, Dr. Wyatt M. Brown, Thomas Allen, late master of the State Grange, and others interested in the tobacco interests of the State. Judge R. Q. Roache, was called to the chair and Wm. M. Ladd was ap-

pointed secretary. Mr. J. A. Gregory explained the object of the meeting. He stated that the Tobacco Association was formed to encourage the growth and handling of tobacco in the State of Missouri, and stated that large premiums had been paid in this market to the planters of the State, and valuable information and seeds had been distributed which had been productive of good results. The trade, however, is now hampered by an old colonial law which the progressive tobacco States have long ago abolished. The Tobacco Inspection Law in this State is very imperfect, and was made to favor only the inspector and the warehousemen. What is needed here is that we should have a method of inspection like Louisville, Cincinnati, New York, and other tobacco centers. In other markets guaranteed samples are drawn, while in Missouri under the present laws there is no guarantee that the samples drawn correctly represent the hogheads from which they are taken. He urged that the Tobacco Inspection Laws should be made to conform to the customs prevalent in rival markets. Mr. Ladd explained briefly the reasons why it is desirable to have a change made in the Inspections Laws and advocated their repeal and that the inspection of tobacco should be placed under the direction of the Tobacco Association as is done in other cities where leaf tobacco is largely sold. Craig Alexander also expressed similar views and stated that his shippers in the interior of the State have expressed themselves in favor of a repeal of the present laws and the appointment of inspectors by the Tobacco Association of St. Louis, which is composed of buyers of tobacco and commission merchants, representing the growers and shippers from the interior. Mr. Gregory stated that the Tobacco Association of St. Louis was one that the farmers could become members of, and have a voice in the election of the inspector, and that it is all important to the planters of Missouri that they should have the same favorable trade regulations in their markets as are accorded to the planters of the other large tobacco growing States. Mr. Roache was at first of the opinion that the organization called the St. Louis Tobacco Association was a combination for the purpose of advancing the interests simply of the buyers of tobacco to the detriment of the planter, but he was glad to learn that on the contrary it was intended to protect the planter's interest as well as the interest of all others in the trade; he fully approved of the plan for abolishing the present inspection laws and was willing to leave the matter of inspection under the control of the buyers and the sellers of tobacco, the latter being the representatives of the planter. He was further impressed with this opinion from the fact that planters can become members of the Association and can have a voice in the matter if they should desire to do so, and that while the present law prohibits the planters from opening a warehouse on their own in St. Louis, if the law is repealed they can have their own inspectors here if they think proper, and have their own inspectors if the plans adopted here for the sale of tobacco should be not in every way favorable to their interests. Mr. Gregory, Mr. Ladd, Mr. Boyd, Mr. Dormitzer and Mr. Clark made explanatory speeches, and finally it was determined by Judge Roache that the executive committee of the State Grange would take under advisement the memorial to the Legislature which had been read to the meeting, and would report what action the representatives of the Grange would take at an early day, after which the meeting adjourned.

## THE TOBACCO MARKET.

## DOMESTIC.

NEW YORK, February 6.

The Leaf tobacco market has been less active during the past week than when previously noticed. The aggregate business done, however, has been fair, all things considered. The demand for Western leaf has been steady, though moderate as to quantity. "The Bremen market," observed a factor to us, "is more active on lower grades, and there has been increased inquiry here for lugs." The activity we have had in January through the operations of manufacturers has subsided, as their immediate wants have been filled. Our stock of leafy, or Louisville lugs has run down, and what there is left is composed of very common planters' lugs, with a few lots of good factors' lugs. There was some inquiry for good dark leaf, but the market is nearly bare of this description.

**Western Leaf.**—Messrs. Sawyer, Wallace & Co., report: "The receipts in January (including Virginia), were 1,806 hhd. Exports, 4,667 hhd. Sales, 5,000 hhd. The stock in warehouses decreased 6,169 hhd. The Home Trade bought freely, manufacturers taking 1,741 hhd, mostly good fillers, at 10¢11¢; cutters 69¢ at 11¢12¢; jobbers, 425¢; speculators, 10¢; and Exporters 2,118. Prices throughout were very firm, and the market apparently on a steady, healthy basis. Since 1st instant we note sales of 451 hhd, of which about one-half for Spain. Receipts continue small and exports liberal.

**SELLING TOBACCO.**—Correspondence *Rural World*.—Gov. COLEMAN:—There is a dispute in our neighborhood about farmers selling tobacco in hand or twist. Some say they are allowed to sell in that way, and others say they are not, without violating the law. We have finally agreed to leave the disputed question to you. Will you please answer in the next issue of the *Rural World*, and oblige? S. T. BAKER, Sullivan, Mo.

**Remarks.**—We have not a copy of the law before us, but know that it is very specific and severe against selling in the way you suggest. The party thus selling subjects himself to fine and imprisonment. We think the law an outrage upon the civilization of the nineteenth century, and it ought to be repealed. Many a poor man, who has ignorantly sold tobacco in this way, not knowing he was doing any wrong, has been arrested, torn from his family, imprisoned, and lost all he had in the world. Any man who has made any such sale—if only twenty-five cents' worth—can thus be treated. We recollect of hearing of one case where a poor farmer sold twenty-five cents' worth to a neighbor, to be used in ridding his calves of lice, who was subjected to just such treatment, and it cost him his little farm before he got through with the litigation.

**FOREIGN DUTIES ON TOBACCO.**  
In Austria, France, Italy and Spain, the tobacco commerce is monopolized by government, under direction of a Regie. In Germany the duty on American leaf tobacco is 4 shalers per 100 lbs. In Belgium the amount is reckoned after deducting 15 per cent. for tare. The duty is 13 francs, 20 centimes (\$2.40 gold) per 100 Kilogrammes (100 American lbs. equal 45.45 kilos.) In Holland the duty is 28 cents, gold, per 100 kilos. (50 American pounds being equal to 112 kilos.) In Russia the duty on leaf tobacco is 4 roubles, 10 kopeks per pud; on smoking tobacco 24 roubles 40 cop. per pud, and on cigars 2 roubles, 20 cop. per pud. The "pud" is equal to about 36 American lbs. In Turkey the duty is 20 cents, gold, per 100 American ounces. In England the duties are on unmanufactured, stemmed or stripped and unstemmed, containing 10 lbs or more of moisture in every 100 lbs weight thereof (besides 5 per cent., and an additional charge of 5 per cent. on removal from bonded warehouses), 3s. per lb; containing less than 10 lbs of moisture in every 100 lbs weight (exclusive of the extra charges noted above) 2s. 6d. per lb. On manufactured, Cavendish and Negrohead (cut or twist), 4s. 6d. per lb; all other kinds 4s. per lb.
