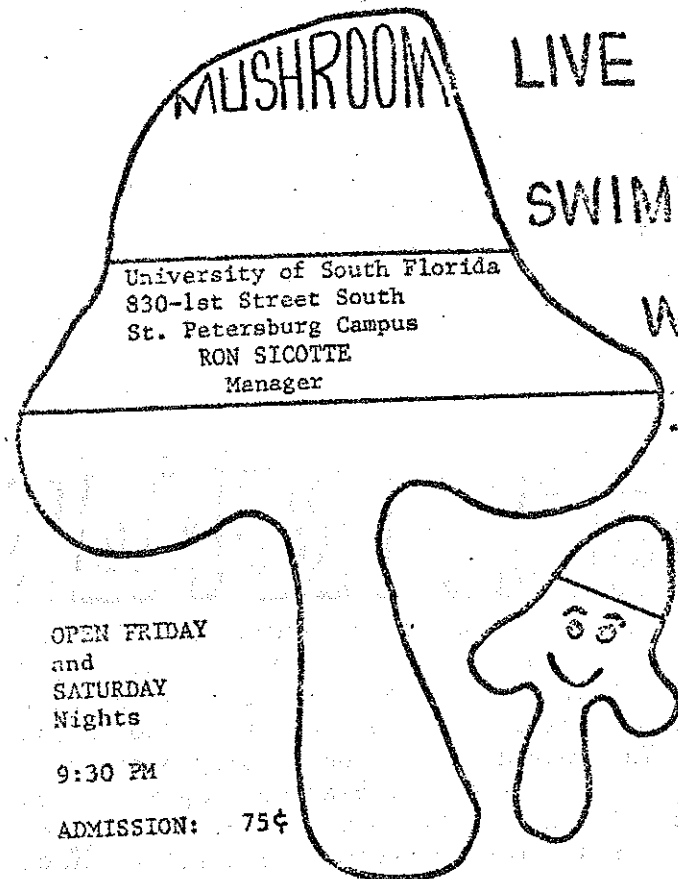

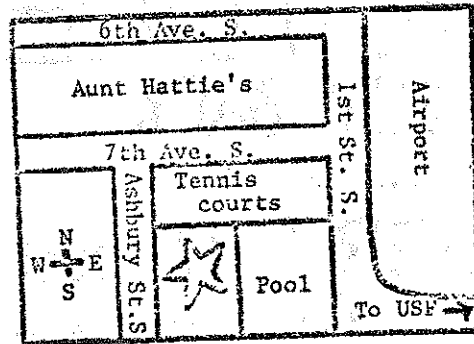

EMERGENCY MEDICAL AID

If you are a full fees paying student of the University and become ill or are injured while on campus, certain medical services are provided by the University without direct cost to you.

1. Ambulance service will be provided from the campus to the Bayfront Medical Center Emergency Room or the Suncoast Medical clinic; this service provided by Suncoast Funeral Chapels, Inc.
2. Basic Emergency Room costs will be covered (at \$10). Additional treatment will be covered if provided for in the Emergency Room up to \$25. The Emergency Room costs will be paid as a result of illness or accident occurring on campus. Off-campus medical care is your own financial responsibility unless authorized prior to treatment by the Office of Student Affairs, St. Petersburg Campus.

3. A Student Accident and Sickness Insurance Plan can be purchased through the University which provided comprehensive coverage at minimal cost. This is recommended especially for the St. Petersburg student for whom accessibility to the Student Health Center, Tampa Campus, is somewhat inconvenient.

The clinic and infirmary service of the Student Health Center, Tampa Campus, are open to all University students.

First Aid Kits to remedy minor injuries received on campus will be available at these locations:
Lifeguard station in Recreation Complex, Day Care Center, Activities Office, B-Building and Receptionist Desk A-Building.

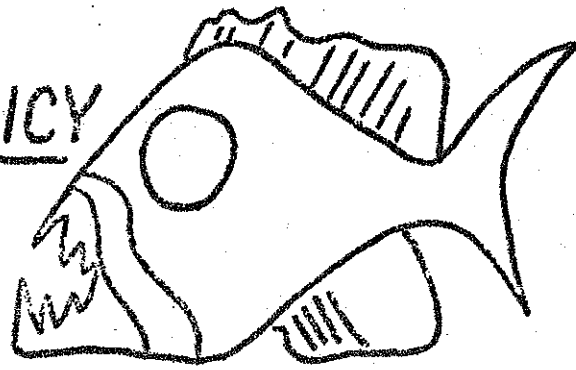

5. Hosts are responsible for the conduct of their guests and will assume responsibility for any injuries incurred by non-USF persons.
6. No running on pool deck. No pushing.
7. No unnecessary roughness.
8. No splashing.
9. Swim at your own risk when Lifeguards are not on duty. Lifeguard's hours are posted.
10. Pick up your trash--don't be a Litterbug.

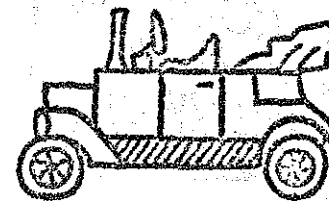

with ROBERT REDFORD, GENE HACKMAN, CAMILLA SPARV

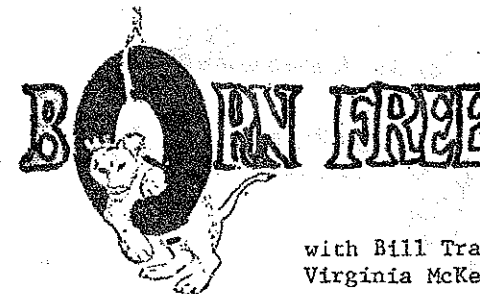

WHOLE-WHEAT BREAD

1 package active dry yeast or 1 cake compressed yeast
2½ cups hot water, ½ cup brown sugar
3 tps. salt, ¼ cup shortening
3 cups stirred whole-wheat flour
5 cups sifted all-purpose white flour

Soften active dry yeast in ¼ cup warm water (110) or compressed yeast in ¼ cup lukewarm water (85). Combine hot water, sugar, salt, and shortening; cool to lukewarm.

Stir in whole-wheat flour and 1 cup of white flour; beat well. Stir in softened yeast. Add enough of remaining flour to make a moderately stiff dough. Turn out on a lightly floured surface; knead 'til smooth and satiny (10 to 12 minutes). Shape dough in a ball; place in lightly greased bowl, turning once to grease surface. Cover; let rise in warm place till double (about 1½ hours). Punch down

ON THE PROWL...

During the past Quarter, several scorpions have been found at various locations on campus. According to Encyclopedia Americana, scorpions are "the most primitive land arachnids and the oldest...are reputed to have been the first land animals." Although the Florida species is not deadly, "the venom of most scorpions causes mild to severe local reactions at the site of the sting." According to W.F. Getty, General Telephone Co., a victim of numerous encounters, the sting "swells and hurts like Hell for several days." Scorpions abound in humid tropical areas and in hot deserts, in a variety of species. The giants are the great black creatures from tropical Africa, frequently seven inches long (average size about half that).

At the beginning of the Quarter, extensive spraying was done on campus to eliminate small bugs and pests. The exterminators, in essence, eliminated the scorpions' food supply. We now seem to have a campus full of hungry scorpions stalking students as they innocently attend classes. Recently a four-incher was found crawling leisurely across the conference room in A-Building, just minutes after the dismissal of Dr. Arnade's History class. Scorpions have also been found in faculty offices and the Auditorium.

According to two local Pest Exterminators, scorpions can be eliminated by a liquid chemical called Bagon.
