Be it Remembered, That on the 12th day of December, A.D. 1901,
José Gil Sensa late of Spain, at present of
 Hillsborough County, Florida, appeared in the Circuit Court of the Sixth Judicial Circuit of Florida, and
 applied to said Court to be admitted to become a citizen of the United States of America; and it appearing to
 the Court by the testimony of J. R. Torres and Maximo Casas
 of Hillsborough, County, Florida, that said applicant has resided in the United States during the last five
 years, and for the year last past has resided within the State of Florida; and it further appearing that
 he made a declaration of his intention to become a citizen of the United States according to the statutes, ~~more~~
~~that he came to the United States while under the age of 18 years~~
~~than two years since,~~ and that he is over twenty-one years of age, and is in all other respects entitled to be-
 come a naturalized citizen: It is therefore ordered that the said José Gil Sensa
 be allowed to take the oath of allegiance to the United States and become a citizen thereof.

Whereupon the said José Gil Sensa takes the oath of allegiance required
 by law and is admitted and adjudged to be a naturalized citizen of the United States of America.
