STATE OF FLORIDA, COUNTY OF HILLSBOROUGH.

Be it Remembered, That on the 28th day of April, A.D. 1902, William A. Simms late of Nassau N.P., at present of Hillsborough County, Florida, appeared in the Circuit Court of the Sixth Judicial Circuit of Florida, and applied to said Court to be admitted to become a citizen of the United States of America; and it appearing to the Court by the testimony of John Cambridge and Edward Williams of Hillsborough, County, Florida, that said applicant has resided in the United States during the last five years, and for the year last past has resided within the State of Florida; and it further appearing that he came to this country while under the age of seventeen years ~~he made a declaration of his intention to become a citizen of the United States according to the statutes, more than two years since,~~ and that he is over twenty-one years of age, and is in all other respects entitled to become a naturalized citizen: It is therefore ordered that the said applicant be allowed to take the oath of allegiance to the United States and become a citizen thereof.

Whereupon the said William A. Simms takes the oath of allegiance required by law and is admitted and adjudged to be a naturalized citizen of the United States of America.
