THE GROWING TOBACCO CROP PROSPECT.

Messrs. Glover and Durrant, of Louisville, have just completed reports from 14,207 correspondents in Kentucky, Indiana, Tennessee, Missouri and Illinois in relation to the tobacco acreage of 1887. The dark and heavy tobacco planting in those States is indicated to be 33 per cent. of that of 1886, and the Burley tobacco planting is 41 per cent. The aggregate planting is 36 per cent.

The Louisville *Courier* of July 19 says: "Frank Wake has been taking the statistics of the tobacco crop recently. A statement showing the comparative result of this and last year's plantings about Palmyra and above on the south side showed the present planting to be 37 per cent. of the crop out last year. Inquiry among leading men of the district from various sections as to their individual plantings shows 62 3/4 acres in tobacco this year, against 1,083 1/2 acres planted by the same parties in 1886."

The Louisville *Courier* Journal observes: "The *Courier* Journal recently published a communication from a highly reliable tobacco man at Union Star, estimating the planting thereabout at 60 per cent. Another correspondent writes to say that the estimate is erroneous and that planting in that section is not more than 20 per cent. But the latter being delayed a day, our original correspondent sends a supplementary note to explain that his 60 per cent. estimate applies to the whole county of Breckinridge."

LOUISVILLE, Ky., July 21.—There is a boom on the tobacco market here. In the past three days prices have advanced \$2.50 per hundred pounds, one of the sharpest upturns ever known on the breaks here.

The acreage last spring on account of over production and small profits was by common consent among farmers greatly cut down. At the close of the setting season, about June, it was found the acreage was only seventy per cent. of the average amount. Prices began to advance, and at the same time dealers in the Burley districts bought heavily to hold for a rise and have since continued to buy. This kept the market strong. Several fires have occurred also, destroying some ten million pounds.

Upon reports just in of a further shortening of the crop by dry, hot weather, prices began to jump and have reached the highest since 1885. Three months ago good Burley sold for \$3 and \$10 and extra at \$14. To-day a hoghead of good Burley sold for \$30, and eight hogheads averaged \$26.75. Buyers for Eastern factories are scrambling to fill large orders, and the figures will go still higher. —*N. Y. Herald*, July 22.

EDITOR OF LEAF.—

BUSINESS TROUBLES.

GUGGENHEIMER & CO.

BALTIMORE, July 20.—Henry Guggenheimer and Marcus Guggenheimer, trading as Guggenheimer & Co., wholesale tobacco and cigars, made an assignment to day to Caesar Cone for the benefit of creditors. The bond of the trustee is \$50,000. Their liabilities are said to be \$50,000 to \$75,000. They have not made up a statement of their affairs, but the assets are estimated at \$25,000. A meeting of the creditors will be called at an early day.

W. D. SMYTH, LYNCHBURG, VA., for a long time one of the most extensive cigarette manufacturers in that city, and recently largely engaged in the leaf tobacco trade, died on Wednesday a dead of apoplexy in the clerk's office of the Corporation Court. The assets are not definitely known. The liabilities are estimated at \$24,000.

WHAT MANUFACTURERS ARE DOING.

COVINGTON, Ky., July 16.

The plug and fine cut tobacco trade for the past few weeks has been quite active, owing to the advance in leaf, which has forced at last prices on manufactured tobacco to the point of almost living expenses. The stock of crop just planted yield no more than the highest estimate yet placed upon it, prices on the manufactured article will advance in the near future to at least three cents more.

Burley is king now in this section. All the factories and agents of factories located else where seem to be stirring after it, both on the breaks and in making purchases in the country.

Tax paid in the Sixth District of Kentucky for month of June was as follows:—

Cigars.....\$1,804 20

Tobacco.....24,251 40

All factories here appear to be comfortably supplied with the new Bull Dog plug and fine cut, McManis with the "Rocky Mtn." Railroad Tobacco Co. with frequent orders for their brands of "K. of L." smoking.

The Lovell & Buffington Co. report a very large trade on "Toukain" fine cut for June.

Perkins & Ernst are very busy and somewhat behind on orders. They are pushing

their best brand, "Blue Grass," for all it is worth.

Trade in a good healthy state with Covington factories.

Tax paid in the Cincinnati district for June:—

Tobacco.....\$9,329 50

Snuff.....176 24

Cigars.....28,747 35

Cigarettes.....281 90

Trade in cigars has been good, and several factories report a handsome increase.

After July 1 the Dayton, Hamilton and Middletown factories will be included in the report of tax paid in the Cincinnati district as the two districts have been consolidated.

CLARENCE.

Lorillard's Climax plug has been advanced three cents a pound. In Detroit plug and fine-cut have been advanced between two and five cents. In St. Louis and elsewhere the price of tobacco has been advanced, but established on manufactured goods, the extraordinary increase in the value of leaf leaving manufacturers no other alternative.

NEW YORK TOBACCO MARKET

FOR WEEK ENDING JULY 22.

Western Leaf—Sales are not large, as reported, reaching only about 400 hogheads, but the market is very firm. Sales for the week have included common lugs and redried cutting leaf at an advance for the latter of about 2 cents a pound, and for the former of about a 1/2 cent over prices of a few days ago. Prices, it is believed, will continue to advance, it being reasoned that if the 1887 crop is only going to be a one third average, the pinch has to come to the heavy buyers between now and winter.

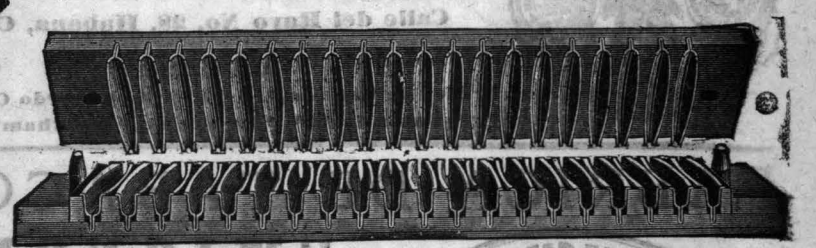

CROP AND MARKET NEWS.

PENNSYLVANIA.

Lancaster *Intelligencer*, July 20:—Several packers have taken a look at their packings of '86 leaf, especially of the "tender" Havana Seed, which they held in low account. They say that much to their astonishment it comes out beautifully, without a trace of damage in it. Some cases of Seed leaf that have been sampled also show up finely, and although it is yet too early in the season to tell just how the crop of Pennsylvania leaf is going to come, the prospect is quite encouraging to packers. The only trouble with Havana Seed appears to be that it is affected by a good deal with white vein and that it will not stand watering or steaming like its more hardy brother the Seed leaf.

Notwithstanding the excessively dry and hot weather here for some time past, the new crop of tobacco is growing finely. Some of the late plantings are in fact, which the plants are scarcely bigger than a man's hand, are suffering for want of rain, but the crop as a whole looks remarkably well. A very large proportion of it has been topped, and a good deal of it will be cut off within a week. Indeed we hear of a patch or two that has been already harvested, thus far not an acre has been damaged by hail, and the plants have been exempt also from insect damages.

Lancaster *Examiner*, July 20:—The local tobacco market remains dull, though the operations for the past week or ten days were larger than for many weeks previous. The reported sales reach nearly 1,300 cases. B. S. Kendig & Co. bought 972 cases of '81 and '85 and sold 208 cases of '85, principally Havana. Skiles & Frey sold a few small lots to manufacturers. Daniel A. Mayer sold 40 cases of '85 Havana to a Chicago party and 65 cases to local manufacturers.

Lancaster *New Era*, July 16:—Nobody is disappointed in the dullness in the market, because it is just what everybody expected. Dealers report a very few transactions, and those on a limited scale. In all not over 125 cases have been sold. This is a slight increase over the sales of last week. For the corresponding week of last year 650 cases were sold.

Much interest continues to be manifested in the new crop. There have been more seasonable rains and plenty of very warm weather, and the result is seen in the astonishing growth made by the plants. In fact, as a prominent grower said to us a day or two ago, "It is growing too fast," although that is not exactly what he meant. He thinks it will mature too soon, that it is too early in the season, and will go into the barns during the very hottest portion of the summer and cannot cure properly in consequence. To cure properly tobacco requires a moist atmosphere at times and not an exclusively heated one. The latter, it is believed, will not fix the color properly, give the proper texture to the leaf, and results in white vein. We had such a season two years ago, and the result is well remembered. Great and continued heat cannot but have a very harmful effect on the crop. If there should be a good deal of rainy weather along with the heat, it would not matter much, but we confess we have some apprehensions of that portion of the crop which is earliest housed. A great deal of tobacco has already been topped. A great deal more work of the same kind will be done during the coming week. It looks as if some crops would be shedded before the 1st of August.

WISCONSIN.

Edgerton *Index*, July 16:—The past week has been a very favorable one for farmers. An occasional shower and good growing weather has made tobacco, as well as other crops, shoot forward at wonderful rapidity. An occasional cut worm leaves his mark in our tobacco fields, otherwise the crop looks well indeed for this time of the year. The principal sale of the week was the transfer of 100 cases by a local packer to Child & Son. Other sales reaching us are as follows:—Wilmer Clark, 4 acres at 7 and 3½¢.

Pomeroy & Pelton shipped to Minneapolis this week a box of tobacco plants which will be grown and then exhibited at the Minneapolis exposition this fall.

Edgerton *Tobacco Reporter*, July 15:—There is very little change to note in the market for old tobacco. A few Stoughton and Janesville buyers have been riding during the week and a few hundred cases of '86 have been moved. Joe Bimberg has purchased about 150 cases in this market and at Milton Junction. The only sales reaching us are: S. R. Foster, 12 cs at 7 and 4¢; H. A. Head, 10 cs, 6¢; R. D. Saunders, 20 cs, 6¢; W. H. Gifford, 13 cs, 8 and 4¢; Pease & Pyre, 18 cs, to Geo. Rumrill, p. t. A 100 case lot of '85 has been sold to Child by an Edgerton packer at prices that will permit of exportation.

The shipments of the week comprise two car loads, 95 cases, to New York.

IN VIRGINIA.

Richmond *Dispatch*, July 15:—At the Tobacco Exchange yesterday Silas Shelburne offered a fine tierce of bright tobacco, grown in Chesterfield county by J. A. Lester, Esq. It was one of the finest offered on our market this year, and was bought by R. A. Frazier & Co. at \$90 per hundred pounds, to be used on their "Lucky Strike" brand of Burley tobacco. This brand is one of the finest that goes to the New England States from this city.

IN NORTH CAROLINA.

Country *Homes Monthly* for July:—On the Asheboro market the sales of leaf tobacco from Oct. 1, 1886, to June 1, 1887, were 3,972,000 pounds, for \$422,525.72, an average of \$10.64.

A prominent tobaccoist and a close observer informed us that the crop in western Carolina was over one-third short, at least from different causes, and that our people who are interested in the matter may so expect. He also said that tobacco—old crop—had advanced the past few days over 60 percent; over 300 packages were sold in Richmond this week for 75 cent more than the goods would have commanded a few weeks ago.

Charlotte *Chronicle*, July 14:—Winston is doing a big tobacco business. A citizen from that place tells us that during three days last week 185,000 pounds of manufactured tobacco were shipped from Winston.

Chicago *Independent Grocer*, July 18:—The largest shipment of smoking tobacco ever made from one factory in one day was that of last Thursday from the Bull Durham factory. It amounted to 160,000 pounds and filled eight box cars. The entire lot was not for one party, but was destined for all parts of the world.

IN FLORIDA.

Key West *Equator*, July 14:—Messrs. M. Barranco & Co. are adding another story to their factory on Front street. Their business is ever on the increase.

IN WISCONSIN.

Evansville *Enterprise*, July 13:—Mr. W. H. Lovell, of Messrs. Jno. Brand & Co., of Elmira, N. Y., shipped an entire train load of Wisconsin tobacco last week from this place to Elmira, N. Y. The tobacco was all bought in this vicinity and packed at the Railroad warehouse.

The Western Tobacco Crop.

The market has undergone some change in tone which extends to all grades of Burley, from common lugs up to fair medium leaf, and from dark lugs up to good leaf. These grades have been irregular throughout the week and easier to buy. The difference is only sufficient to indicate that the demand has not been altogether equal to the supply on offer. The intensity of the weather has resulted in making a less favorable presentation of quality, and packages have sold on less flattering samples. There have also been large lines of reviews, and the repeated

As neither have yet come down, serious fears are beginning to be entertained on that ranch that something has happened to Stebbins. Thus it is that the doctor's most sanguine expectations have been realized, and the name of John Warrington Stebbins has been added to the already long list of the victims of the deadly cigarette.—*Deloitte Free Press*.

Florida Sumatra.

Mr. Frank H. Stout, editor of that model South Florida weekly, the *Fort Myers Press*, sends us from that place several leaves of Sumatra tobacco of that locality's production, which we are bound to pronounce first-class in every respect. He says that "it has not been properly handled or cured," but that "an expert says there is no question but that it could be made a superior wrapper, and command in New York, Havana and Key West \$1.50 to \$4 a pound," adding "our people are turning their attention to tobacco." The samples sent us, as already stated, are very fine, exhibiting all that delicacy combined with strength of texture which gives to the imported Sumatra its great popularity as a wrapper.

We submitted the samples to Mr. F. A. Gonzales, superintendent of Perry & Co.'s cigar factory here, and he was delighted with them. He is a Cuban, and an expert in cigar tobaccos, and pronounces this as fine as anything he ever saw. The price named may be somewhat above the mark, but there can be no question as to the quality. Florida, from the Perdido to the Caloosahatchee, is bound to come to the front in the matter of this important industry.

Mr. Gonzales rolled for the writer a cigar of extra bulk and length, using half a leaf from one of these samples for wrapping, which in point of beauty and smoothness will compare with anything in the market.—*Lake City (Fla.) Tobacco Plant*, July 9.

Reinsuing to Register a "K. of L." Trade Mark.

WASHINGTON, July 18.—The Commissioner of Patents has rendered a decision in the case of an application to register a trade mark for distilled spirits, in which the works "Knights of Labor" and "K. of L. Distillery" appear. The Commissioner states that there is no pretence that the manufacturers of this particular brand of whiskey who seek to register the trade mark are Knights of Labor or are engaged in business with them or under their auspices, yet the distinctive mark points to this labor organization, or to the members as a class, as the origin of the ownership of the article to which it is applied. In other words, the proposed trade mark is in the nature of a false representation and a deception as to the general public, possibly inducing them to purchase an article under the belief that it is manufactured by a society in which they have a friendly interest. The Commissioner, therefore, on the ground of the pretences of such a trade mark, refuses its registration.

The Danville, Va., *Times* publishes reports from the bright tobacco region indicating not more than half or two-thirds of a crop planted and less than half the usual quantity of commercial fertilizers used. In view of the short crop prices have advanced at least 25 per cent.

FOREIGN NOTES.

—In Prussia 1,930 prisoners are employed in the manufacturing of cigars.

—The import duty on tobacco in Germany for the year 1886-87 (1st April, 1886, to 31st May, 1887), after the payment of drawback, etc., brought into the Imperial Treasury \$45,340 marks, against \$83,931 marks the previous year.

—By an arrangement which has been made between Turkey and Persia, the Egyptian duty upon tobacco has been reduced to 75 per cent, of the value. At the same time the Egyptian Government has been permitted to introduce a tobacco monopoly, and a *droit de monopolie* up to 10 piastres per cent, inclusive of import duty.

—Mainheim, Germany.—The news about the result of the second fermentation of the 1886 tobacco is very favorable, so that there can be no doubt whatever as to the goodness of last year's yield. Therefore, as in spite of the dullness of trade good tobacco is always sought after, we can reckon upon high prices, and this prospect has roused an inclination among tobacco planters to plant out more extensively. Unfortunately, on account of the bad weather in May which prevented the seedlings developing properly, there is likely to be a dearth of young plants, and planters have found it necessary to procure some from Alsace. With regard to business, both new and old tobacco are in great request, and if large sales are not made it is because there is not sufficient of the required qualities, and also on account of a disinclination to sell. The better sorts of tobacco for cutting have fetched from 25 to 28½ marks per 50 kilos. Foreign dealers have bought small quantities of 1885 and 1886 striped tobacco for cutting at 70 to 83 marks per 50 kilos transits.—*Tobak-Zeitung*.

VARIETIES.

—Court Officer.—A message from the jury room, your Honor. His Honor—What do they want, further explanation of evidence? Court Officer—No, your Honor, they want a fresh box of cigars.

—The Kentucky Commissioner of Agriculture, in his report for June, says of tobacco: Condition 73, acreage 63 per cent. There is a disposition to increase the acreage of this crop since prices have advanced, but scarcity of plants and dry weather will prevent much more setting of the wood.

—The experiment of tobacco planting in South Carolina was a failure, not because tobacco could not be successfully raised, but because the bottom had fallen out of prices. When the market becomes firmer, the experiment can be repeated with every chance of success.

—The tobacco and grocery press lately have been enumerating the prominent persons who are addicted to the use of the seductive and soothing weed; but as the smoking habit has become so universal, it would be much more interesting to hear of the great men who do not smoke.—*Merchants Review*.

—Mr. Edward Fawcett and Mr. Riddle are exercising their wit on the new cigar named "The Earl." Mr. Fawcett says he hopes it will draw better than the play, and Mr. Riddle flashes back that all the puffing in the world won't make it a good cigar.—*Boston Transcript*.

—Somebody ought to put to these gentlemen that fine old conundrum: Why is a play like a cigar? Because if it is good everybody wants a box, while if it is bad no amount of puffing can make it draw.

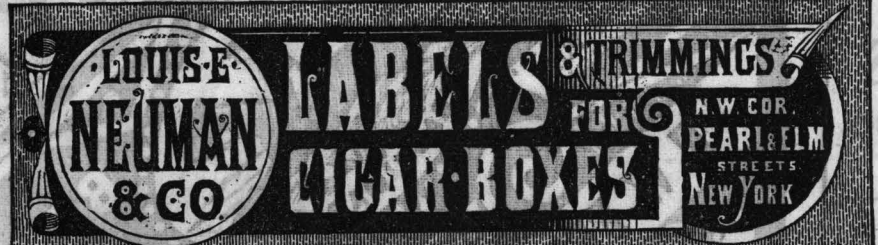

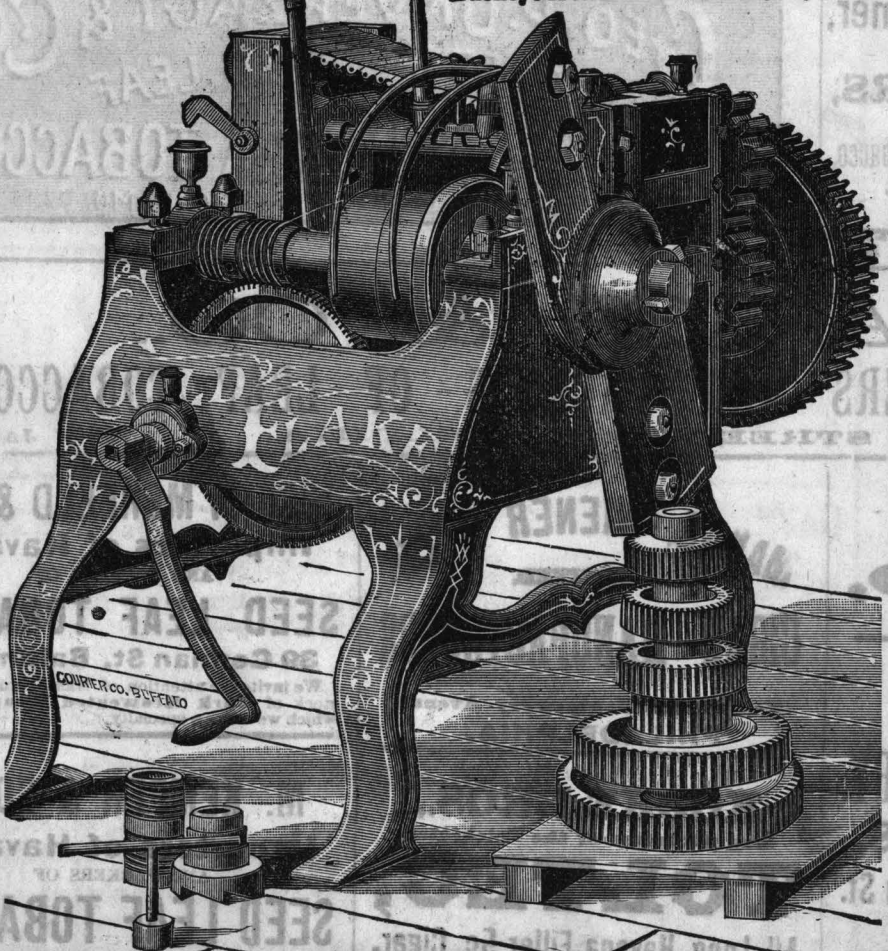

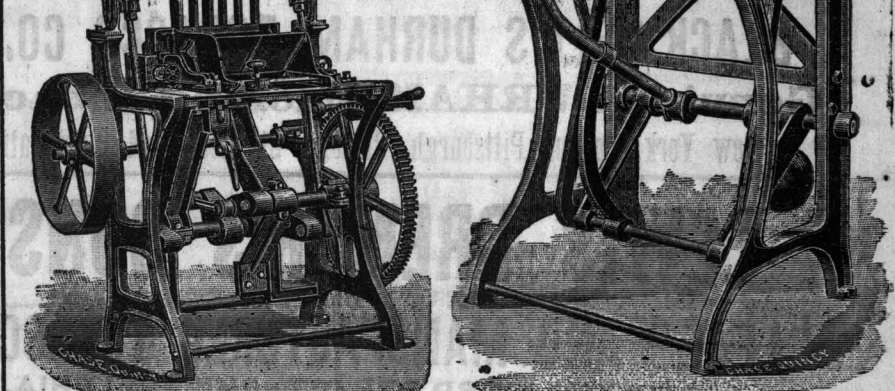

AUSTRALIA—Manufactured tobacco imported, 70 pound duty. Australian manufactured tobacco, 7 domestic leaf, 34 cents a pound internal tax; made of leaf, 48 cents a pound tax.

BELGIUM—Leaf tobacco and stems, 70 francs kilost; manufactured tobacco, cigars and cigar cases per 100 kilos; other kinds, including stripped 100 francs per 100 kilos.

CANADA—On tobacco, the excise duty on foreign which formerly was 80c per lb., but of late years has reduced to 15c, is restored to 30c. The duty on the leaf, which up to 1883 was 8c, and was then reduced advanced to 5c. The customs duty upon tobacco an average of 20 to 30c per lb. lighter and imported 10 to 30c per lb. Cigarettes put up in packages weigh less than one-twentieth of a pound each, and are valued at 34c per lb., instead of 38c, as heretofore, and on most snuff, when containing over 40 per cent of water when put in packages of less than 8 lbs each, 5c weight.

ENGLAND—Manufactured Tobacco—Cigars, 5c Cavendish or Negrohead, 4c per lb. Cavendish or head manufactured in bond, 4c per lb. Other manufactured tobacco, 4c per lb. Snuff containing more than 10 per cent moisture in every 10 lbs weight thereof, 3c 8d per lb. Not containing more than 10 per cent moisture in every 10 lbs weight thereof, 4c 6d per lb. Unmanufactured Tobacco—Containing 0 lbs or more of moisture in every 100 lbs thereof, 3c 3d per lb. Containing less than 10 lbs of moisture in every 10 lbs weight thereof, 3c 6d per lb. In lieu of drawback allowable before May 3, 1887, there is now the drawback of 3c 8d named in section 1 of the Customs Tobacco Act, 1883.

GERMANY—Cigars and cigarettes, 270 marks per 100. Smoking tobacco in rolls and snuff boxes, 18 marks per 10 kilos duty. Pressed tobacco, 25 marks per 10 kilos duty. Leaf tobacco and stems 3 marks per 100 lbs. Strips or stemmed leaf, 180 marks per 100 kilos duty.

HOLLAND—Tobacco in rolls or leaves and stems, 28 cents duty per 100 kilos; pressed stems, 24 cents per 100 kilos. Manufactured tobacco, snuff, etc., 4.80 duty per 100 kilos. Cigars, 15c duty per 100.

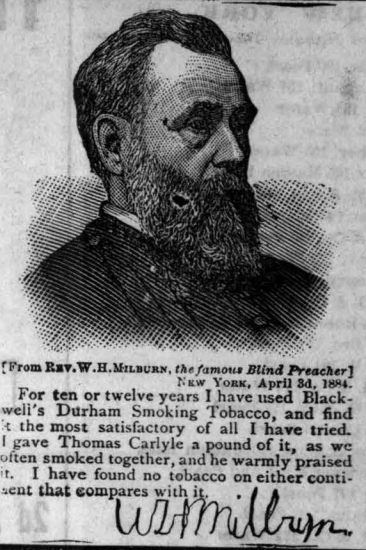
