AS IT IS AND MAY BE THE OUTLOOK OF DARK LUGS AND LEAF.

At Louisville good parties are purchasing dark lugs and leaf with confidence, under the impression that manufacturers will be before long take such goods for their pipe stock or common brands of smoking. They say that for good or pet brands, like "Star," "Climax" and "Planet," they may be willing to follow the Burley market still higher, but that the great mass of consumers of common smoking would quite as soon have their pipes filled with Green River stock as with Burley, which they can get at one-half the price of the latter, and if coincident with this home demand an export inquiry for Spain or elsewhere should arise, prices of dark common would feel a decided upward impulse.

THE TOBACCO CROP.

The Department of Agriculture reports as follows:

The tobacco yield per acre is very low in the shipping and cutting leaf belt, especially in the West. The average reported per acre is: For Maryland, 638 pounds; Virginia, 600; North Carolina, 485; Arkansas, 520; Tennessee, 430; Kentucky, 505; Ohio, 615. For cutting and cigar leaf: Indiana, 397; Illinois, 403. On the acreage reported in the August investigation this will make scarcely more than a third of a crop. The yield of the cigar leaf is nearly normal.

THE SITUATION OF WESTERN LEAF VERY STRONG—EXPORT VARIETIES SURE TO BE HIGHER.

Taking into consideration the stocks in the markets of the world, including Western, we find them 33,000 hogheads in excess of what they were last year, while the exports from New York are 39,000 hogheads less than last year, and 43,000 less than the year previous. Looking at these figures it would seem that with an 1887 crop variously estimated at from 75,000 to 100,000 hogheads, capital, outside and inside of this city, may be invested here in tobacco with a big chance for profit.

Assuming, for argument's sake, that this year's crop will amount to 100,000 hogheads, there will be in it, perhaps, 35,000 hogheads of Burley; and assuming, furthermore, that Italy will require in 1888, say 19,000, France 9,000, Spain 13,000, Austria 3,000, altogether 44,000 hogheads for contractors' account—it will be seen that 79,000 of the 100,000 hogheads are thus appropriated, leaving only 21,000 hogheads of dark tobacco to supply the wants of our home manufacturers and the open markets of Europe.

Burley leaf—such has been the home demand for it—has been exported only in limited quantities this year, and it is certain that existing and prospective prices will prevent the export of this variety next year. However, then, are the export requirements to be met,

in view of the fact that home wants will be first looked after, except at holders' prices. These observations do not include what is left of the old crops, the remnants speaking for themselves.

According to appearances now, capitalists might make a "corner" here in Western leaf that would increase prices at least two cents a pound within the next ten days. The position of stocks at the West is well secured.

Jos. S. Gans and Meyer Rosenthal, of Gans Bros. & Rosenthal, leave to-day for Cuba on a purchasing tour. This firm bought nearly a year ago from first hands, and the success they have had in disposing of their purchases leads them to repeat the experiment.

MR. GRAFF'S NOTES BY THE WAY.

BALTIMORE.

The Baltimore tobacco firm of H. Hamberger & Co., manufacturers of and jobbers in plug tobacco, have opened a branch at 51 North Queen street, Lancaster, Pa. They will carry there a full line of all kinds of popular plug and cigars for the accommodation of their many Pennsylvania customers. I. Levi, an old and tried hand of the old firm, is the manager.

Marburg Bros. are erecting a grand new factory in addition to their present one and connected with the same. When completed the new edifice will be second to none in this land of ours.

The market in Ohio and Maryland leaf tobacco is somewhat dull. The '87 crop of Maryland is estimated at 35,000 hogheads, and Ohio about 4,000. Our Richmond correspondent, W. E. Dibrell, had better add these figures to his supplementary statements; 40,000 hogheads, less or more, means considerable.

The Manchester Cigar Co. have removed their factory and warehouse to 15 North Howard street. They occupy a large factory and a handsome store.

Brian & Co., cigar manufacturers, and successors to Geo. R. Coffroth & Co., manufacture a very popular article, the "Florida Cigarette." They state that Moens & Mannheim, Cincinnati, O., imitated their brand, and that they intend to put an injunction on such business.

Geo. P. Unversagt & Co., packers and dealers in leaf tobacco, report business very fair, with ample orders to keep them busy. This firm hold a good stock of all kinds of Seed leaf tobacco.

Joseph Perlman & Co. hold a fine lot of '87 Housatonic leaf, purchased lately in the valley.

Sneeringer & Co., dealers in leaf tobacco, have commenced the importing of Havana tobacco, and will hereafter continue to do so. This is one of Baltimore's good and reliable firms.

W. Brooke Tunstall, late of Baxter & Bird, is the representative of the well-known Petersburg firm of S. W. Venable & Co. This gentleman sells lots of goods for that solid old house.

Hearn & Bock is a new firm for the sale of manufactured tobacco and cigars wholesale.

S. Rosenfeld & Co., the old-time jobbers in plug, smoking tobacco and cigars, have quite a big trade in a new brand, "Rosenfeld's Gem." This is a piece of three-leaf twist of Virginia manufacture and a superb chew. This firm was established as far back as 1840 and stands high in tobacco circles.

Among those of Baltimore's leaf dealers who hold lots of Wisconsin, Pennsylvania and Connecticut leaf, S. Liebman & Dellevie may be mentioned.

RICHMOND.

Tobacco manufacturers, almost without any exception, have had a pretty fair and paying year. Of course there are in every trade firms who constantly keep busy, and this is the case among many of the older and long established manufacturers of Richmond. The tobacco interest is on the increase. New factories are being built and others enlarged, but all of them are looking for a boom. Manufacturers of plug and trade-dull, with the exception of a few leading ones like G. W. Smith & Co., Peters & Fioi and McCorkle & Bowman. With John W. Carroll, of "Lone Jack" fame, it is never dull, and the Lone Jack Cigarette Company have doubled their sales during the year. The city of Lynchburg is wonderfully improving. Armstrong & Preston, smoking tobacco manufacturers, have orders ahead.

FROM THE HOUSATONIC VALLEY.

(BY OUR SPECIAL.)

NEW MILFORD, Conn., Nov. 5.

EDITOR TOBACCO LEAF—

Nothing to report except that the weather is clear and dry. Farmers are anxiously waiting for the first frost to set in, so that they may begin to harvest their crops.

Very little buying is done at present. Jos. Hornsheim of New York was here this week and bought a few crops.

D. E. Soule shipped Levy Bros. 10 carloads of tobacco this week, and will send them three cars more early next week. PLEASE.

will hardly yield one-fifth extra fine bright leaf. Of old there is a small supply, comparatively speaking, and pray why then should not prices advance?

James B. Pace, the retired tobacco merchant and manufacturer, has built and presented to the M. E. Congregation of Richmond a church such as perhaps cannot be found anywhere South. It is a magnificent structure and will perpetuate his name for many generations to come.

George Cameron, the Petersburg tobacco manufacturer, returned a few days ago from a wedding tour throughout Europe and Australia.

Wm. Cameron has built a very large and handsome tobacco factory at Petersburg.

Richmond will have another tobacco factory in operation on or before January 1, 1888. Messrs. R. H. Boykin and E. M. Seddon, both sons-in-law of Col. W. S. Venable, of Petersburg, are the owners.

Boykin, Bland & Co., of Petersburg, tobacco manufacturers, will dissolve January 1, and Mr. Jackson will continue the business.

S. A. Ellison & Bro. are said to be the largest handlers of tobacco and stems in the United States.

A new brand of fine smoking tobacco has been introduced to the public by W. J. Yarbrough & Sons. It is "Yarbrough's Golden Rain" curly cut. This tobacco is packed in handsomely decorated tin boxes, containing 4 oz. each. It is for sale by Stephen Tilton & Co., Boston; Sprague, Warner & Co., Chicago; A. Seemiller & Sons, Baltimore; Esberg, Bachman & Co., San Francisco, and Dohan, Carroll & Co., New York.

At the old tobacco factory of Hardgrove & Co. they were busy, orders from the Pacific coast and Baltimore and Southern markets coming in steadily.

"Dill's Best," manufactured at the Model Factory, Joseph G. Dill proprietor, is just now a favorite plug South and East—Boston especially. This tobacco is made of sun-dried, for the Southern and Eastern States, of fine Burley, with bright wrapper.

P. T. Conrad, the well-known and popular leaf merchant, was married to Miss Maggie Peggam, of Richmond, Oct. 24. Both families are prominent ones. The happy couple are now travelling West and Northwest.

W. T. Hancock, another old tobacco manufacturer, has had a fair year as far as sales and profits are concerned. His brands, like his name, are well known in the United States. Mr. Hancock's "Old Port" sells like his "twists" and "sun-dried" East and West; but "Old Port" takes the lead. Friend Hancock has many thanks for favors.

I stated that several new factories were being built. The P. B. Pace Tobacco Co., who already run one of the largest in Richmond, are building another adjoining, which, when finished, will cover an entire block. It is hardly necessary to make any comments upon this successful firm, as they are so well known and do such a thriving business. They have more than doubled their sales this year. Their twists and snuffs sell largely on the Pacific coast, and they manufacture constantly private brands for jobbers and grocers East and West. Mr. J. H. Neimyer, Jr., is the able general manager, and Mr. Gerhard Casar, formerly Lorillard & Co. manufacturer, does the manipulating of the inside work.

Among the leading buyers at the Richmond Tobacco Exchange, James M. Wise is one, and many years' constant work has given him such experience in the markets of Virginia and North Carolina that the interests of such manufacturers as Drummond of St. Louis, and other important ones, are left to his care in these markets. Mr. Wise is certainly a most careful and representative. Strover & Raab, dealers in Virginia and North Carolina bright leaf, have completed another new warehouse in Henderson, N. C. It is only a year since this firm finished one in Durham.

P. H. Mayo and family returned by steamer *Britannic*, October 28th, from an extended European tour. This is the third trip Mr. Mayo has made to Europe.

The other new factory I mentioned above as erected will be occupied by P. Whitlock, manufacturer of the "Old Virginia Cigarettes," therefore will not be a plug institution, but a genuine plug and cigar factory, on a grand scale. It is located on Franklin, near the second street, in the very center of Richmond's tobacco district. The dimensions are 60x125, five stories high, with a capacity for 500 or more hands. Mr. P. Whitlock has spent a lifetime in the cigar business, commencing as a boy on a small scale, and is today the largest cigar manufacturer south of the Potomac. For his "Old Virginia Cigarettes" he has large sales, and deals only with jobbers such as Sprague, Warner & Co., Chicago; Rice & Co., St. Louis. Wagner & Kallam represent him in New York, and Adams, Adams & Co. in Boston.

C. F. Russell, manufacturer of cigarette and smoking tobacco, has received the following letter from the Governor of the National Home for D. V. S. and desires agents in our larger Eastern and Western cities:—

SOUTHERN BRANCH NATIONAL HOME FOR D. V. S. HAMILTON, Va., Sept. 8.

Carroll, of "Lone Jack" fame, it is never dull, and the Lone Jack Cigarette Company have doubled their sales during the year. The city of Lynchburg is wonderfully improving. Armstrong & Preston, smoking tobacco manufacturers, have orders ahead.

Nothing to report except that the weather is clear and dry. Farmers are anxiously waiting for the first frost to set in, so that they may begin to harvest their crops.

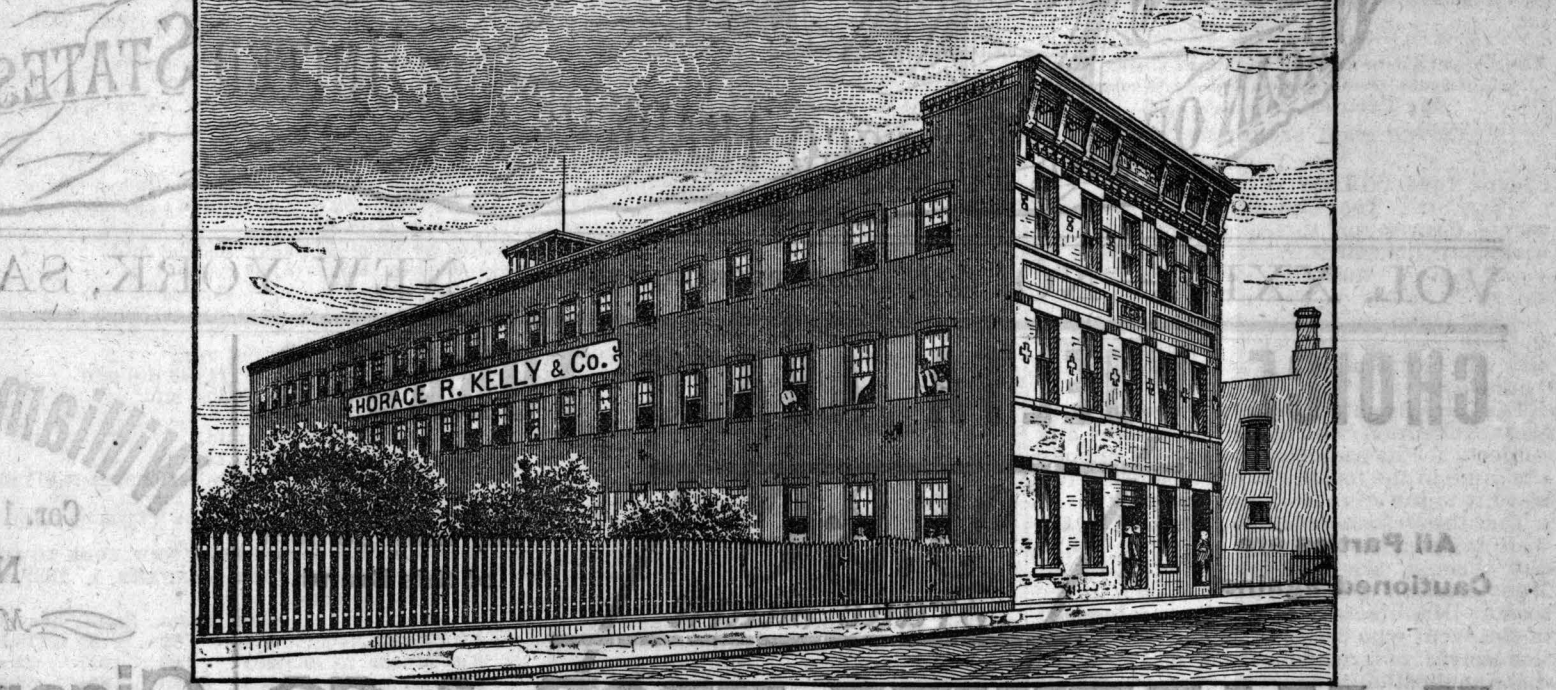
Very little buying is done at present. Jos. Hornsheim of New York was here this week and bought a few crops.

CORRESPONDENCE.

THE TOBACCO TAX QUESTION.

LYNCHBURG, Va., Nov. 9, 1887.

EDITOR TOBACCO LEAF—

In writing a few days ago to one of our papers, in reply to an article from the Cincinnati *Tobacco Journal* suggesting that every manufacturer of tobacco who feels an interest in having the tobacco tax question settled by the next Congress "should go or send a representative to Washington at a given time, and there present their opinion on the subject, either through a convention or by individual expression of views, and then fully enlighten Congress, etc.," I said: Now, this may be a wise suggestion, but not for the reason suggested, as the tobacco tax question has been fully and thoroughly discussed for many years, and it would be unduly tedious for every intelligent person in and out of Congress. What we need at Washington is not so much information on this and other great questions affecting the public good, but sound, faithful representatives in Congress, who will do what they believe to be right, regardless of any and all outside influences.

Observing that the tax question, rather than the tax itself, has been the bone of the tobacco trade, and as this can never cease as long as any tax exists, however small, all the manufacturers in this country favor its abolition except those who have used it as a lever for fraud and those who have large means and are rapidly monopolizing the trade in manufactured tobacco. No argument is needed at this day to convince Congress that the tax on tobacco ought to go, and we believe it will be taken off in the early days of the next session, and the law put into effect at once, with a rebate clause. Your Mr. G. informed me to-day that there was to be a meeting in New York on the 16th inst. of cigar manufacturers and others to consider this and other questions, and that they would probably recommend a convention of tobacco men to be held in Washington city early in December. Upon reflection, I believe a convention is desirable, if not necessary, to place this tobacco tax in its true light before Congress and before the people interested in it. The tax must be abolished. It is no longer needed by the Government. It is oppressive to the planters. Men of large means are taking advantage of it to crush out small operators and build up monopolies. Unprincipled men are using it as a lever for fraud, by evading the payment of the tax in whole or in part, or by using the same stamps more than once.

The Premium Tobacco Sale at Raleigh, N.C.—Large Sales and Full Prices.

(SPECIAL TELEGRAM.)

RALEIGH, N. C., Nov. 6.—Yesterday was one of the biggest trade days in the tobacco business in the history of Raleigh. Although the tobacco handlers had a great deal of that staple article consigned to them, the business men of Raleigh took advantage of the opportunity to draw a still greater quantity, and with the Tobacco Board of Trade made up a premium list of \$1,000 in gold and numerous useful articles, which were awarded to the successful competitors.

Our correspondents, Messrs. Reed & McGee, send us the appended summary of the auspicious event:—

RALEIGH, N. C., Nov. 9.—The one feature of our market for the past week has been the "Big Premium Sale." The sale was started promptly at 9 o'clock Friday morning, and lasted through two days, selling at the rate of 150 piles to the hour. Over 400 loads of the weed were here, coming from fourteen different counties.

Among the prominent visiting buyers present we noticed Mr. L. L. Strouse, of Messrs. Strouse & Rant, Richmond, Va.; Mr. James N. Boyd, of Richmond; Mr. D. H. Holcomb, of Danville; Capt. W. E. Parry, of Durham; Mr. Haldeen, of Durham; Mr. Fleming, of Henderson, and Mr. Jeffers, of Oxford.

Prices started off high and were well maintained throughout the two days. The highest price paid was \$200 per hundred, and over 4,000 pounds of weed were sold at \$100 per hundred. The whole number of pounds sold were 108,000, at an average price of \$23.52.

Not a ticket was turned during the entire sale, showing that the planters were well pleased and prices full up. To sum the whole up, the sale was a grand success, and Raleigh scored a big day.

Fred Wambach, 2213 North Front street, continues to have a wonderful demand for his brands of cigars, especially the "Butterfly."

This week's business shows the effect of the election. Very few buyers were to be seen from out of the city. Nevertheless the local trade showed a very promising record, and did not confine purchases to any specialties.

The removal of the Bythiner Leaf Tobacco Company to 116 North Third street, where increased advantages as well as stock are offered, has proven a decided success. Business has improved wonderfully and very satisfactorily.

It is astonishing to see the amount of leaf tobacco moving in and out of George Burghard & Co.'s, 328 North Third street. They move along without regard to dull times.

A Good Word for the Theatre.

At the Howard street Methodist Church last night Dr. Hartsord said: "In some respects the children of this world are wiser in their generation than the children of light." They build their theatres in the most prominent places in all our cities. They fit up the entrance in the most gorgeous and attractive manner possible, that men cannot pass without knowing what is going on. In the interior the comfort of the people is consulted by giving them the latest and best opera chairs."

The Doctor did not believe a theatre could be run successfully in some churches for six months without changing the interior arrangement. He thought it would be well for churches to imitate "the children of this world" in making their places of worship attractive and pleasing to the masses. He also said that men could not be forced, but could be won by sympathy, by warmth and by contact. "The children of this world" is nearly perfect, but it is insufficient to save men. We must go down among men, down by the side of the humble son of the carpenter, down by the side of bleeding, broken humanity, that into their wounds may be poured the oil of healing. Then, too, men must be won by individual effort one by one, but the Holy Ghost fire upon the hearts of men must be the inspiration."—San Francisco Examiner, Oct. 17.

NEW YORK TOBACCO MARKET

FOR WEEK ENDING NOV. 11.

Western Leaf.—The week has been a short one on account of the observance of election day. Trade was moderate, but the sample rooms were generally well attended by prospective buyers. It is not unlikely that within the next few days we shall be able to report transactions of some magnitude, as the big operators can purchase now for less than they may be able to do in the near future, the position of holders seeming stronger than at any time this season. As it is here, so it is at the West. The Louisville Courier-Journal of the 9th says:—

"The market for Burley tobacco and Green River fillers fully maintained the high scale of prices previously established, and in all cases differences were made, they were in all cases probably for still higher prices. Dark and heavy tobaccos were active and firm, both for leaf and lugs, and common leaf being taken at irregularly better prices."

The Cincinnati Enquirer of the same date observes:—

"The market to-day, with large breaks, the general class of which was of poor quality, continued strong and active for all grades, there being no change in prices from the preceding day. Medium leaf was in active demand and taken at full prices. Good to fine leaf showed the same activity noted heretofore, and full quotations were received. Common classes of trash and lugs remain in active request, bringing full figures."

Virginia Leaf.—This market does not appear to have been active, and we can only report sales of a few bright smokers and Burleys.

Cigar Leaf.—With a few exceptions our dealers report a dull week's business. There was some demand for Housatonic wrappers, for which good prices were offered, but very few were to be found. Now that the Spanish Seed is nearly all bought up, packers are showing freely their samples of broad leaf. If our cigar manufacturers were busy, which they are not, they would probably manifest some interest in this variety of tobacco, but in the present condition of trade they do not seem to be eager to examine anything.

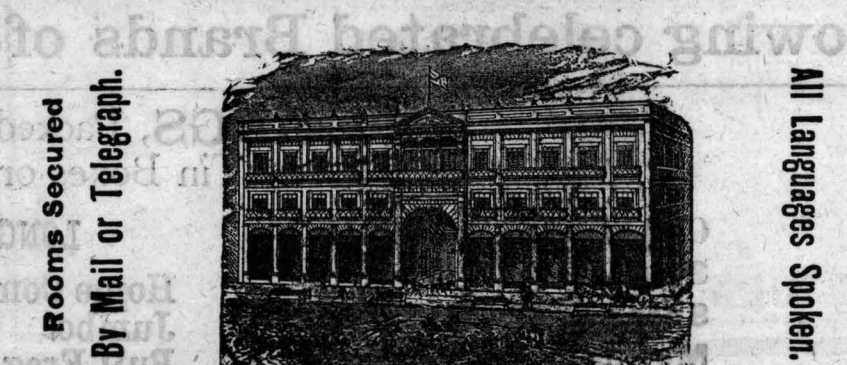

United States Consular Reports.
 TOBACCO.
 From the Consul at Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, dated June 27, 1887:
 The tobacco of Mexico is of such excellent quality that it is said by many to equal that of Cuba, and there is no doubt among those acquainted with Mexican tobacco that such a comparison is admissible.
 The best cigars of Vera Cruz and Tabasco are not excelled by the best of Havana in form and flavor. Perhaps, however, the superiority of the leaf from the celebrated Vuelta Abajo is most apparent in that exquisite aroma which the tobacco of no other country possesses, and which, to the senses of the smoker, is the most delightful and ravishing of perfumes. On the other hand, the Mexican cigars burn much more freely than those of Cuba, which must be constantly in the mouth of the smoker or they become extinguished.
 The manufacture of tobacco in Mexico into cigars and cigarettes of a fine quality is of comparatively recent origin, dating from the Cuban insurrection of 1868, when a number of refugees from that island landed in Vera Cruz and there established factories for the manufacture of cigars and cigarettes of the tobacco of the country. Since that time factories have been established in all parts of the Republic where tobacco is produced, and the tobacco industry now furnishes employment for many laborers and skilled workmen.
 Vera Cruz in 1886 contained four important factories for the manufacture of tobacco, "La Union," "La Especial," "La Prueba," and "La Nacional," besides various establishments on a smaller scale. These four factories employ among them more than a thousand workmen.
 In San Andres Tuxtla there are ten factories of the first order, three in Jalapa, and many in Orizaba, Puebla, San Luis Potosi, the City of Mexico, and elsewhere. The factories produce cigars of all qualities, ranging in price from \$20 to \$200 per thousand. Cigars are manufactured of every size and every shade, and great ingenuity and taste are displayed in devices of elegant ornament to attract the eye of the smoker.
 In the cultivation of tobacco increased care and intelligence bestowed on each succeeding crop are augmenting greatly the production and improving the quality of the leaf, while better methods of packing, selection and distribution in classes are observed in its preparation for market.
 A disregard for these last particulars has diminished the acceptability of Mexican tobacco abroad, as much tobacco was formerly exported from Vera Cruz in the condition in which it would arrive from different places of the interior, the good and bad packed together indiscriminately without regard to quality. This was especially the case with commercial houses making shipments of tobacco for the purpose of placing funds in Europe to greater advantage, and to avoid the heavy loss by exchange. The houses of Vera Cruz which are regular exporters of tobacco now use all due care in its selection and preparation for exportation, with the result of increased estimation for the tobacco of Mexico in the markets of London, Hamburg and New York. Much Mexican tobacco shipped to these places is manufactured and sold as that of Havana.
 The Valle Nacional, situated between the States of Vera Cruz and Oaxaca, produces tobacco of the finest quality and is entirely devoted to that purpose. The tobacco of San Andres Tuxtla, Acapulco, Jathpan, and other portions of the same region, is of excellent quality. Tabasco produces large quantities of tobacco of a class inferior to that grown on the Gulf coast, though the wrappers of Tabasco are much esteemed for their smoothness and fineness of texture. The cigars of Tabasco are highly appreciated by smokers. Tobacco of an inferior quality is raised in Orizaba, Chiapas, Cordova and Oaxaca.
 The price of tobacco in the leaf for wrappers and filling varies in different localities, ranging for filling from four to fifteen dol-


