

## 'Food for Thought' Series to Feature Author Barry Estabrook Jan. 25

The USF St. Petersburg Food for Thought Lecture Series continues with its third iteration on Monday, Jan. 25 at 7 p.m. in the University Student Center. The event will feature a presentation by author Barry Estabrook that will be followed by a Q&A and book signing. [RSVP online.](#)

Estabrook, a bestselling author, has written for the New York Times, Washington Post, *Men's Health*, and many other publications, and served as a contributing editor to *Gourmet*. His book *"Tomatoland," a story on the U.S. tomato industry with a focus on Florida*, won a James Beard award, and he has recently published a new book titled "Pig Tails: An Omnivore's Quest for Sustainable Meat."

*The book is an expose pertaining to questionable farm practices while also communicating an appreciation of the animal and those who take great care in raising hogs.*

The Food for Thought Lecture Series, which celebrates food and culture through photography, writing, film and a new Sunshine State cuisine, is sponsored by Northwestern Mutual, the Florida Humanities Council and Wells Fargo. The series will conclude on Monday, March 21 at 7 p.m. with the screening of "The Search for General Tso" and a director talk-back with Ian Cheney. The documentary explores the origins of Chinese-American food by looking at this ubiquitous dish that is largely unheard of in China.
