OUTAGE AT LOUISVILLE.

We publish below a circular sent us from Louisville, giving some of the particulars of the issue that has been joined between a number of the leaf tobacco buyers and warehousemen of that city respecting outage charges. The difference that has arisen is a serious one, and is made all the more so by the fact that not less than thirty-six prominent buyers have discontinued purchasing tobacco at the old warehouses as a consequence of the disagreement, and are hurriedly instituting measures to make themselves independent of them. They have already established, or caused to be established, a new warehouse, are soliciting trade to it, and are projecting a new Exchange, to be known as the Louisville Tobacco Exchange. All true friends of the Louisville market will regret the occurrence of an event so likely as this one is to interfere with the regular progress of the splendid trade which has been built up there by the joint efforts of those now at variance on a question of business policy. It is, of course, to be presumed that the pending difference will be temporary; but while it lasts, be the time of brief or long duration, harm will inevitably be done by hindrance or diversion of traffic to new local channels. It will be well, in our judgment, for both parties to the dispute to exert themselves still further to the end that an agreement mutually acceptable may be quickly reached. When a similar topic some months since agitated the New York leaf tobacco market, it seemed for awhile as if harmony of view between the contestants was utterly impracticable, but, finally, the warehousemen conceded what the sellers and buyers required of them, and there was an end of the struggle. Perfect harmony on the subject of outage has since prevailed here, and the old warehouses, being unfettered by rivals, are still masters of the situation. As we have not heard the claims of the Louisville warehousemen, we cannot and do not undertake to advise them in a matter so peculiarly their own. They understand their own affairs and will be guided, no doubt, by their own sense of prudence and propriety; we mention the experience of the trade in this city merely to indicate how the evils of diversion were averted, and not as an example for them to follow, though it would, perhaps, be better for them if they would follow it.

The buyers whose names are appended to the circular claim that four-fifths of Louisville's enormous leaf tobacco trade passes through their hands, and they peremptorily refuse to longer pay two dollars per hoghead warehouse charges. They think the charge should be one dollar and twenty-five cents per hoghead, and include one month free storage, instead of four months, as are now allowed. Some of them buy and ship promptly, and, therefore, do not value for themselves the liberal time allowed for storage. Others avail themselves of the privilege of storage, and all agree that twenty-five cents a hoghead per month, after the first month, will be fair compensation therefor. The warehousemen dissent. The situation is critical, and there is need of calm deliberation. For the buyer who ships his goods soon after purchasing them it certainly seems a burdensome charge to have to pay as much outage as the man who stores in warehouse for four months, and this is one of the strong points which the

buyers make. It is one, too, which appeals directly to the sense of justice of even those who are not identified with the movement that has been inaugurated. Ninety-nine men of a hundred asked for their opinion regarding the inequality here implied, would answer that there was no justification for it.

The general question involved in this whole issue, viewed on its merits, is one of business, or perhaps of expediency purely. The warehousemen have a perfect right to charge two dollars outage if they see fit, and the buyers have a perfect right to seek, as they are doing, to reduce that rate by application to the warehousemen, which they have made, or by instituting new methods, as they have done. Possibly the warehousemen may feel as if they cannot accept lower rates; if they cannot, their tenacity in contending for the old ones is excusable, even if shown to be untenable. Certainly the buyers feel that they cannot afford to hereafter pay the old rates, and they therefore cannot be blamed for their action in the premises. Our warehousemen here thought they could not afford to take less when, prior to January 1, 1878, they were receiving one dollar and fifty cents for entry, and a like amount for outage; total, three dollars per hoghead charges—one-half paid by seller and one-half by buyer—and forty cents per month storage, the first month being free. Notwithstanding their repugnance to change, the rates since January 1, 1878, have been, per hoghead:—

Inspection	\$1.00
Outage	1.00—\$2.00

As we have been informed, the warehouse fees per hoghead at Louisville are as follows:—

From Seller	\$2.00
From Buyer	2.00—\$4.00

Two dollars more than in New York, minus the difference in storage allowed. Waiving the item of free storage, which seems to be of value only to a few, the question is at once suggested, Why should not the charges at Louisville be at least as low as they are in New York? Since labor and rent are much less in the former than they are in the latter place. Estimating a hoghead of tobacco at the value of \$70, which is probably a fair average, we will see what the respective charges upon it are at Louisville and in New York, including four months' storage:—

Louisville—	
To Seller	\$2.00
Commission at 1 per cent	.70
Buyer	2.00—\$4.70
New York—	
To Seller	\$1.00
Commission at 2½ per cent	1.75
Buyer	1.00
Storage	75—\$4.50

Showing that the charges are higher at Louisville than they are in New York, after allowance is made for the difference in commissions and free storage. Perhaps the 20 cents per hoghead paid by Louisville warehousemen to inspectors will about balance the charges in the two markets; but where will the offset be found for the difference in labor and rent in the two places? Four months free storage are accorded at Louisville, and only one month in New York; but 40 cents per hoghead for one year's storage, minus four months free, at Louisville, amounts to \$3.20; while one year's storage in New York, minus one month free, amounts to \$2.75. Plainly, either New York warehousemen are doing their business at unremunerative rates, or Louisville warehousemen are erring in not conceding what the succeeding buyers demand or solicit.

The warehousemen may make a grave mistake by assuming that because they have established connections with growers and shippers; have for many years controlled trade, and have all the force of practice and precedent on their side, they can compel the disaffected buyers to come to their terms. Every day, almost, evidence is presented where old forms have to give place to new ones, when the latter are advocated by resolute and capable men; and that the thirty-six men who have withdrawn their patronage from the old warehouses are both resolute and capable there can be no question. Nor is there any doubt that, if impelled to it by continued resistance, they will succeed in inaugurating, on their own account, a system of sales and rates of charges more in harmony with their desires than the one to which they now take exception. Warehousemen are sustained by buyers, not buyers by warehouses, and this self-evident proposition must be borne in mind by those who may be deluding themselves with the conceit that the buyers, rather than the warehousemen, must come to terms. If it shall appear that the Louisville tobacco interest is impaired by the unfortunate occurrence of which we are treating, and, at the same time, that the warehouse charges, either to buyer or seller, are excessive, the blame for the misfortune must attach to the warehousemen. It may not be long, it is well to remember, before sellers will also believe they are charged too much for the privilege of disposing of their goods; and if the new Enterprise Warehouse, with others that may be started, foster the theory that they are, and proffer equal facilities at reduced rates, which they can do, supported by a majority of the buyers, it needs

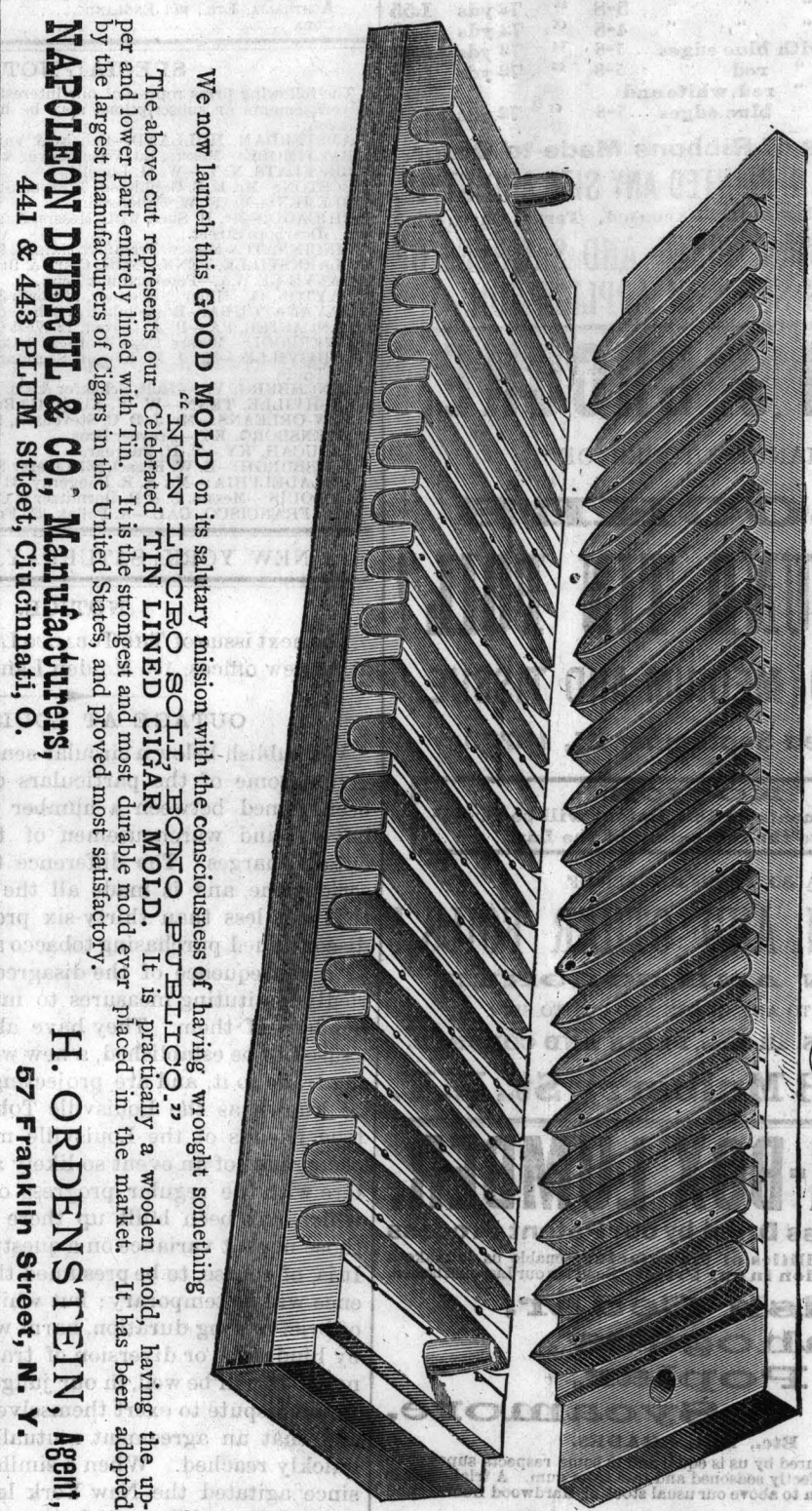

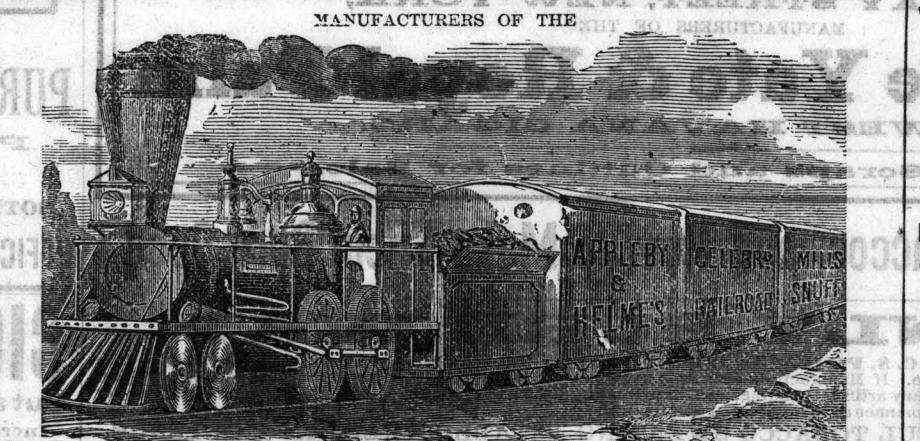


