it upsets our mode of business altogether; inasmuch as, based upon the strength of American truth and honesty, it has for years been a rule with us to sell tobacco by the American samples, which, necessarily, must cease if faith can no longer be placed in the correctness of the samples."

Speaking of Maryland tobaccos the same authority remarks:

"The better descriptions are difficult to dispose of, owing principally to the fact that very frequently the samples taken here do not correspond with those from abroad." It further adds regarding "Ground-leaf": "The business since the sale by American sample of 83 hogsheads to arrive has come to a complete standstill, the tobacco when re-drawn here turning out to be sandy and in a very precarious condition."

Concerning a sale of a small lot of "Bay," "mostly of color and yellow quality, suitable for the northern trade," the writer avers, "it was likewise effected by the American samples, and paid for correspondingly high. A large portion of this tobacco proved to be evidently misrepresented by the American samples, which gave rise to great annoyance to all concerned."

All this is, to say the least, very unpleasant; yet to show that the respective statements are strictly true, it is only necessary to announce that they are copied from a circular of high commercial standing. The initial paragraph quoted above, we have been informed, refers to Kentucky or Western leaf samples, and is intended to apply to certain samples drawn in the vicinity of New York city. We may go so far as to say, we know of New York shipping firms who have been enjoined by their European correspondents not to purchase Kentucky leaf in this market on account of the alleged unreliability of some of the samples drawn here. The time when such a reflection upon the skill and integrity of our inspectors would have been regarded with sincere regret, and there is little doubt that it will be so now, when it is remembered that the circumstance is made the means of impugning their honesty as a class and of injuring the reputation of this market in foreign countries. Periodically public proclamation is made in Europe of the annoyances and losses incident to false sampling in some of the interior markets of the United States, but at the present time specific charges relating to the same evils are directed towards this metropolis. Complaints of this nature ought not to be possible anywhere, and it is to be hoped their number hereafter will be materially lessened. It is as easy to draw fair as unfair samples, and inspectors the world over are expected to be, as they are generally believed to be, both capable and honest. In the carelessness of employees is where the trouble lies. But this must be more carefully guarded against than it sometimes is. The situation of the New York leaf trade is such that it cannot afford for pecuniary reasons, to say nothing of moral ones, to allow the carelessness of anybody to add to its dead-weights.

THE FAILURE OF EDWARD A. SMITH.

During the week a representative of THE TOBACCO LEAF, hearing certain rumors concerning Mr. Edward A. Smith (whose failure we noticed in our last issue), visited that gentleman's office, which was found locked. From a person evidently placed at the door to answer inquiries, it was ascertained that the office had been closed for several days, and that Mr. Smith had not been there since last Saturday. Our representative then visited Brooklyn to interview Mr. C. C. Smith, the father of Edward A. Smith, from whom he learned that the absence of his son from this city was by advice of his counsel. This gentleman stated that his son would return to this city, but when he could not say, and that all debts owing by him would undoubtedly be settled in an honorable manner. While in Brooklyn our representative obtained the following schedule, made by Mr. Smith and signed by him under date of Dec. 22, 1879:

MINOR EDITORIALS AND NEWS ITEMS.

MORE THAN PROBABLE.—It is more than probable that New York capital will shortly be used to establish a plug tobacco manufactory at Chicago.

We had the pleasure of a call from our friend, Mr. W. Eggert, Jr., of the firm of Eggert, Miller & Co., of Cincinnati. Mr. Eggert is the son of the well-known Wm. Eggert, of this city, and is here on his annual business tour.

BUSINESS TROUBLES.—E. C. Jackson, tobaccoist, of Toronto, Canada, it is reported, has made an assignment. The amount of his liabilities is not stated, but they cannot be large, and his creditors cannot be numerous, as he was carrying on business with only a small capital.

DIED.—Mr. Samuel Ayres, of Richmond, Va., a veteran of the tobacco trade in that city, died a few days since. Mr. Ayres had been in business many years in

Richmond, and always was a highly respected member of the trade. He formerly did business on a large scale, but latterly his operations have been limited in character. Mr. Ayres had reached a good old age, dying high in the seventies.

A PATENT LITIGATION.—In the United States District Court in Chicago suit was commenced a few days since by Messrs. J. A. Robinson, manufacturers of cigars in that city, against Louis P. Sutter, Adolph Sutter, and Jacob Sutter, who are charged with an infringement of a patent of the complainants. The patent was issued on the 10th of June last, and was granted to Abraham Robinson on the invention of an apparatus for preparing leaf tobacco for cigars.

PROPOSED CHANGE IN TIN-FOLI TOBACCO STAMPS.—WASHINGTON, Dec. 23.—A number of leading tobacco manufacturers from New York held a conference with Assistant Secretary French, of the Treasury Department, and the Commissioner of Internal Revenue to-day. The manufacturers protested against the proposed change in the manner of printing internal revenue stamps on tin-foil tobacco. The Department promised to consult the wishes of the trade before making any alterations.

OBITUARY.—Mr. S. Leopold, for many years connected with the tobacco trade in its various branches in Louisville, Ky., and lately representing the firm of Finzer Bros. of that city, we are sorry to say was killed in the depot of the Pennsylvania Railroad at Pittsburgh, while waiting to take a train eastward. Mr. Leopold was some years ago one of Louisville's most prominent tobacco manufacturers and leaf dealers. We deeply regret the event which has deprived his numerous friends of his genial companionship, and the community of such an upright and worthy citizen.

THE MELBOURNE EXPOSITION.—The Secretary of State, desiring to secure a good exhibition of American goods at the Melbourne International Exhibition, which is to be opened Oct. 1, 1880, has appointed Mr. Thomas R. Pickering, of Connecticut, an agent on behalf of the United States Government to solicit exhibits. Mr. Pickering has opened an office at Room No. 102 at the City Building, New York, where all information regarding the regulations of the Melbourne Exhibition can be obtained. The United States will not assume the expense of shipping goods, but will, through its Commissioner, receive the goods at Melbourne, assign them to a proper space in the Exhibition buildings, and publish a catalogue of the list of exhibitors.

SALE OF SEIZED GOODS.—Periodically the customs authorities of this city clear out the accumulated stock of goods that are seized by their officers. One of these public sales took place on Monday last, and embraced a great variety of things, but mostly cigars, cigarettes, snuff and liquors. Cigars were offered as they were seized, from one box of 100 to lots of 5,000. There were cigars from Germany, Cuba, Manila, the East Indies, Africa and China. The prices obtained for these ranged all the way from \$30 to \$135 per hundred. It was stated by those who knew that in nearly every instance the cigars sold at this sale could be duplicated regularly at twenty five per cent. less, and for fresh goods, if bought of the leading importers. The amount realized will be between \$8,000 and \$9,000.

TOBACCO IN SHOW-WINDOWS.—Boston Herald, Dec. 18: In the United States District Court, before Judge Nelson, this morning the jury in the case against Herman Henoch reported that they had been unable to agree, and they were discharged. Their deliberations lasted from 3 P. M. yesterday till midnight, the vote varying from ten for conviction to nine for acquittal. This case was made a test case under Sec. 3,363, Revised Statutes, and involves the question whether loose tobacco can lawfully be exposed in shop windows. The Government claimed, as a matter of law, that the exposing of loose tobacco in shop windows, having attached to it written or printed labels of the price per plug or piece, was an offer for sale within the meaning of the statute, and that the defendant's intent to sell was immaterial. This view of the law was not taken by the court, who ruled that it was a mixed question of law and fact for the jury, and instructed them that they were to determine whether the tobacco had been exposed for sale, taking into consideration all the circumstances of the case. The defendant claimed that he never sold from the window, and that the tobacco therein was simply exposed as a sample. The result of the case seems to be that tobaccoists may safely expose loose tobacco in their shop windows for the purpose of exhibiting it as a sample. C. J. Brooks, Esq., for the defendant.

The wax paper manufactured especially for tobacco, cigar and cigarette purposes by Messrs. Regenhart, Shevill, & Co., of this city, should be tried by every manufacturer. It can stand 140 degrees of heat without melting, and preserves the flavor and quality in tobacco.

—Mr. Edward Hilson, of Messrs. Foster, Hilson & Co., will be made a happy man on the occasion of his marriage on the 20th of next month.

—Mr. F. H. Lohmeyer, packer and dealer in Seed leaf tobacco, of this city, claims to have been one of the first operators in and buyers of this year's Housatonic Valley crop. Mr. Lohmeyer bought about 300 cases, which he is now packing, and also claims that he possesses a very choice lot of tobacco.

A CELEBRATED CASE.

DETROIT TOBACCO MERCHANTS ON TRIAL FOR ALLEGED CONSPIRACY TO DEFAUD THE GOVERNMENT.

Verdict Expected To-Day.

PROCEEDINGS IN COURT.

(Continued.)

(From the Detroit Post and Tribune, Friday, Dec. 19.)

The trial of Sigmund and Feist Rothschild, on a charge of conspiracy to defraud the revenues of the Government, was resumed in the United States Court yesterday morning with J. D. Bartlett on the witness stand.

On cross-examination he said that he never sent Lichtenberg to Rothschilds' to effect a settlement. Lichtenberg came over to Windsor with a proposition from Sigmund Rothschild. In a conversation in the District Attorney's office, Sigmund said that he would do anything in his power to fix up the matter for Sigmund, but would do nothing on account of the firm of Rothschild & Bro.; he said his wife was worrying him night and day to fix the matter up on account of Sigmund's family. He said he wished to avoid the scandal of a trial, and his wife went on the witness stand to make the matter split him wide open. In a conversation in the Rothschilds' store about examining the Rothschilds' books, Mr. Dickinson, counsel for the Rothschilds, said that Sigmund had been very foolish to throw his books open for inspection without any conditions; that he should not permit abstracts of his books to be made. The Sigmund books were taken to Windsor for his inspection several times. Witness was present when Sigmund prepared his statement. Witness had made diligent search for Sigmund's letter-book, but had not been able to find it.

SIGMUND M. SIMPSON

was recalled, and said that when he went to Windsor, Burnstine had good collaterals for more than the amount of his witnesses indebted to him. When Burnstine saw that witness was making a good thing out of the crooked tobacco business, he raised his rates of interest in order to get his share of the profits of the business.

The District Attorney here announced that the case for the prosecution was closed.

At twenty minutes to 11 o'clock Don M. Dickinson arose to open

THE DEFENSE.

He commented upon the value of a good reputation, and said it would be shown that Sigmund Rothschild had lived and done business in this city for 25 or 30 years, and in that period not a whisper had ever been heard of him being dishonest or unprincipled as a business man. Such a reputation ought to stand against the assaults of a self-confessed criminal. Though he believed the Government had made out no case on which to put the Rothschilds upon their defense, and they had a good ground to ask the court to discharge them, yet they did not wish their case decided by a single man; they wanted to go out from the court room with a verdict of acquittal from the jury. Therefore they should go into a defense and explain all the circumstances which may be regarded as suspicious. The theory of the prosecution is that the conspiracy was formed on a ferry-boat by Sigmund, Salomon and Sigmund Rothschild. It was on that trip that Sigmund says the matter of the 46 bales was talked over and agreed upon. The defense will show that at the time of that trip Salomon had not even opened his case of samples; that therefore it was impossible that anything could have been said about the purchase of 46 bales, which purchase was entirely a subsequent transaction; that Salomon had no old tobacco samples; that all his tobacco was new, and that the 46 bales bought by Sigmund was new tobacco; that the 45 bales afterward bought by Rothschild from Sigmund were the same new tobacco, and that the 46 bales were the same new tobacco. The defense will also show that the Rothschilds had the capacity in their manufactory to work up 40 bales a week, and they might have destroyed the identity of this tobacco in a few days instead of leaving it in their store to be seized by the Government two or three months after it had been received. The theory of the defense is that Sigmund might have run through tobacco and taken it to the Rothschilds' shop, where it would have been made into cigars and its identity destroyed at once. This would have obviated the necessity of changing the marks on the packages. It will be shown that when Kaufman Rothschild and Sigmund, in February, that a detective was after him, the latter asked him to tell him, and Rothschild said that George Moebus told him. Sigmund then said he would sue Moebus for slander if he said so. The two then went to Moebus, and Sigmund made the same statement to him. It will be shown by the defense that at the time the crooked leaf tobacco was being sold on the Rothschilds had abundance of leaf tobacco in their store, and their territory in the bonded warehouse was full; that instead of paying duties, they might have taken advantage of Sigmund's operations if they had been parties to the conspiracy and got their tobacco duty free and made it up into cigars at once and it could never have been identified. It will be shown that the 45 bales were selected by the Rothschilds' foreman, and Sigmund Rothschild never saw it or knew anything about it until it was seized by the Government officers. It will be shown that Sigmund Rothschild helped Sigmund socially and in business on account of his having been related to the theory of the defense that Sigmund, in order to gain immunity for himself, made up this story implicating the Rothschilds; that by searching his books he was able to pick out the 46 bale transaction and the 35 bale transaction, which have been colored so as cast suspicion upon the other bales. Sigmund will show himself by injuring the man who had set him upon his feet socially and in a business way. This Mr. Dickinson characterized as not only dishonest, but as partaking of that element of dishonesty which is universally regarded with detestation.

Sigmund argued at some length upon the testimony introduced by the prosecution. His opening occupied about an hour and a half, and closed with the expression of the belief that the jury would give a verdict of acquittal, and send the defendants out of court without a blot or stain upon their hitherto fair name. The testimony for the defense opened the question of ROTHSCHILDS' REPUTATION.

Upon the question of reputation of Sigmund and Feist Rothschild in this city for honesty and fair dealing, the witnesses called were John W. Strong, Albert I. James, J. Logan, Chipman, Wm. G. Thompson, Theodore H. Hinchman, Moses W. Field, A. H. Hey, Wm. D. Wilkins, Charles Buncher, Samuel Heavrich, Emory Wendell and Geo. V. N. Lothrop, all of whom testified that that reputation is good.

SIMPSON'S REPUTATION.

Mr. Heavrich testified that Sigmund applied for admission to the Phoenix Social Club, but there was objection on the ground of his bad reputation, and the application was refused. Sigmund then applied to the Association of Sigmund Rothschild and others, and the representation that he had married into an excellent family, those who had opposed Mr. Simpson withdrew their opposition, and he became a member in 1877.

On cross-examination he testified that the Phoenix Club numbers about 80, and 8 votes rejects an applicant. Mr. Simpson was elected when his reputation was bad. He still retains his membership in the club. Martin Butzel testified that Sigmund's reputation when he came here was bad, and that he would not believe him under oath.

E. S. Heineman testified that the reputation of Sigmund was bad, and he would not believe him under oath.

Theodore Schuneman knows Mr. Simpson, and considers his reputation bad; would not believe him under oath.

George Moebus also considers Sigmund's reputation bad. On or about the 14th of January, 1879, witness

told Kaufman Rothschild that he had heard that Sigmund was engaged in crooked business in the bonded warehouse, and that a detective was after him. He said he would go and see Sigmund about it. He did so, and afterward on the same day Sigmund came there and wanted to know why witness was telling such stories about him; said they were hurting his credit and business, and he would make it hot for witness if he did not stop telling such stories. He said he did not deny packing domestic tobacco in Havana bales, but he had not done any crooked business in the Custom House. Sigmund had bought empty Havana packages of witness.

When Salomon came to Detroit he always spread out his samples at the Rothschilds' store. Witness saw Salomon's samples when he was here in May last; was looking for some old tobacco, but Salomon had none. Saw Sigmund and others there looking over the samples. New tobacco was worth about 55 or 90 cents; old tobacco was worth \$1.10 to \$1.15. Did not buy any of Salomon at that time.

Louis Kuttner testified that Sigmund had bought empty Havana packages of him; said he was going to pack domestic tobacco in the shape of Havana bales. Isaac Rosenfeld was present at Rothschilds' store in May last when Salomon exhibited his samples. Witness examined all of them but found nothing he wanted, because he wanted old tobacco, and Salomon had nothing but new.

John H. Campbell also visited the store of the Rothschilds when Salomon had his samples spread out there, and examined them in connection with Moebus and Rosenfeld. There was no old tobacco in Salomon's lot; was looking for it, but couldn't find it. The 45 bales bought by the Rothschilds was bought for old tobacco, and so far as it has been worked no new tobacco has been found. The price paid was \$1.05, the price of old tobacco.

Alexander R. Schmidt, who has charge of the tobacco stock for the Rothschilds, remembers when Salomon came here on the 4th of May; gave witness his check and had his trunk of samples brought up from the depot to the Rothschilds' store. The trunk was not opened until Tuesday morning; witness opened it and spread out the samples on the counter for inspection. Mr. Rosenfeld was the first man to examine the samples. They were also examined by Moebus, Gordon and Sigmund. Witness examined them as he took them out of the trunk; all were new tobacco, which was inferior to the old tobacco. Noticed particularly the samples of the 46-bale lot, because Sigmund bought that lot; it was new tobacco.

Letters from Salomon to the Rothschilds were introduced to show that the latter guaranteed Sigmund's accounts with Salomon before the date of the alleged conspiracy.

The Rothschilds' books were exhibited to the jury, and the erasures pointed out by the prosecution were explained by the witness. He said the original entry was made to correspond with the invoice. Afterward the invoice was weighed and there was found a shortage of about 100 pounds. The figures in the book were then erased and an entry made to correspond with the actual weight, etc.

On the 1st of April the Rothschilds had about 400 or 500 bales of imported tobacco in the bonded warehouse; probably had about the same in May; were getting in tobacco all the time. The amount of duties paid by the Rothschilds in the month of May was \$2,564.10.

The counsel for the defense sought to show that the Rothschilds had a very large amount of tobacco in the bonded warehouse and paid duties to the Government to the extent of \$450,000 a year, and from that they wished to place before the jury an inference that it would be extremely improbable that they would engage in so petty transactions as those testified to by Sigmund.

Will H. Hawley, clerk of the Russell House, was introduced, and pointed out in the travelers' register of that hotel the entry of Mr. Salomon's name on the 4th day, the 4th of May, 1879, and left on the evening of the following Friday.

The Post and Tribune of Saturday, the 20th, says:—Alexander R. Schmidt, stock-keeper for the Rothschilds, being still on the witness stand, testified that on the 4th of April they had in the bonded warehouse 433 bales, and the 1st of May 444 bales; the amount did not diminish in June. In the month of May they paid \$2,564.10 duties on tobacco withdrawn from the bonded warehouse for their own consumption. The amount of duties paid by them for the first six months of this year was \$33,383. The present year was an unusually poor year, on account of the poor quality of the last year's crop of Cuban tobacco. The firm sometimes pay duties on tobacco sold to and withdrawn by their customers. They must pay the duties in cash, but it frequently happens that they take notes in payment of the tobacco, including the duties. The Rothschilds have a cigar factory, and have worked up as many as 25 bales a week. After the tobacco was seized by the United States marshal at the Rothschilds' store, it was stored there until the 5th inst. It was simply enclosed with a picket fence, through which any one could have passed.

On cross-examination witness said the 45 bales were sold to Gordon & Campbell by sample. They were sold on commission for Sigmund, and were never bought by the Rothschilds. The amount of the commission was five cents a pound. He pointed out the entry of \$260 being the amount of commission on 5,207 pounds.

Dr. Isaiah Jones testified that he has known Sigmund about a year; met him in Windsor on the 16th of November. Sigmund then said he had got himself into a pretty bad scrape, and must get himself out in some way. He said he had done business with the Rothschilds and Burnstine, and they had made money enough out of him; they were well fixed, and now they should help him out of his present scrape. He said he had been promised immunity if he should implicate the Rothschilds and Burnstine, and that it was necessary for him to do so to get free. He asked witness to tell him what he should do. Sigmund then told him to tell him, and Rothschild said that George Moebus told him. Sigmund then said he would sue Moebus for slander if he said so. The two then went to Moebus, and Sigmund made the same statement to him. It will be shown by the defense that at the time the crooked leaf tobacco was being sold on the Rothschilds had abundance of leaf tobacco in their store, and their territory in the bonded warehouse was full; that instead of paying duties, they might have taken advantage of Sigmund's operations if they had been parties to the conspiracy and got their tobacco duty free and made it up into cigars at once and it could never have been identified. It will be shown that the 45 bales were selected by the Rothschilds' foreman, and Sigmund Rothschild never saw it or knew anything about it until it was seized by the Government officers. It will be shown that Sigmund Rothschild helped Sigmund socially and in business on account of his having been related to the theory of the defense that Sigmund, in order to gain immunity for himself, made up this story implicating the Rothschilds; that by searching his books he was able to pick out the 46 bale transaction and the 35 bale transaction, which have been colored so as cast suspicion upon the other bales. Sigmund will show himself by injuring the man who had set him upon his feet socially and in a business way. This Mr. Dickinson characterized as not only dishonest, but as partaking of that element of dishonesty which is universally regarded with detestation.

Sigmund argued at some length upon the testimony introduced by the prosecution. His opening occupied about an hour and a half, and closed with the expression of the belief that the jury would give a verdict of acquittal, and send the defendants out of court without a blot or stain upon their hitherto fair name. The testimony for the defense opened the question of ROTHSCHILDS' REPUTATION.

Upon the question of reputation of Sigmund and Feist Rothschild in this city for honesty and fair dealing, the witnesses called were John W. Strong, Albert I. James, J. Logan, Chipman, Wm. G. Thompson, Theodore H. Hinchman, Moses W. Field, A. H. Hey, Wm. D. Wilkins, Charles Buncher, Samuel Heavrich, Emory Wendell and Geo. V. N. Lothrop, all of whom testified that that reputation is good.

SIMPSON'S REPUTATION.

Mr. Heavrich testified that Sigmund applied for admission to the Phoenix Social Club, but there was objection on the ground of his bad reputation, and the application was refused. Sigmund then applied to the Association of Sigmund Rothschild and others, and the representation that he had married into an excellent family, those who had opposed Mr. Simpson withdrew their opposition, and he became a member in 1877.

On cross-examination he testified that the Phoenix Club numbers about 80, and 8 votes rejects an applicant. Mr. Simpson was elected when his reputation was bad. He still retains his membership in the club.

Martin Butzel testified that Sigmund's reputation when he came here was bad, and that he would not believe him under oath.

E. S. Heineman testified that the reputation of Sigmund was bad, and he would not believe him under oath.

Theodore Schuneman knows Mr. Simpson, and considers his reputation bad; would not believe him under oath.

George Moebus also considers Sigmund's reputation bad. On or about the 14th of January, 1879, witness

interview Mr. Russell, attorney for Mr. Salomon, wished that a safe conduct might be given Sigmund to come over, but Mr. Jerome said there was no use of that. Sigmund would not come over without a safe conduct upon him of papers in the case of Salomon against him. That remark put an end to the talk about a safe conduct.

Anton Von Boyn and J. S. Kloppenburger were called to read the disputed sentence in the Salomon letter to Sigmund, and they translated it "Havay yoo no letters." The court intimated very plainly that there had been controversy enough over this letter; that it did not have much weight any way, and that he was inclined to charge the jury that the sentence being in dispute, and competent judges being unable to agree as to its meaning, they should not construe it against the defendants.

Moses Schott, bookkeeper for the Rothschilds, testified that when Sigmund Rothschild is away he, witness, attends to the notes, etc., himself. The Rothschilds have several times guaranteed bills for Sigmund to Salomon. In May last Salomon was here and sold 46 bales to Sigmund. He urged Sigmund to guarantee the bill, and finally offered him 10 per cent. for doing so, and Sigmund accepted the offer. This was on the Tuesday afternoon after Salomon arrived. After the receipt of the invoice for the 46 bales it was sent to Sigmund. The notes of Sigmund, endorsed by Sigmund Rothschild, were taken to pay for the 46 bales, and also a copy of the letter which enclosed them to Salomon, and dated August 2. On the 15th of August Salomon came and brought the notes back, saying that Sigmund had run away and he had no further use for the notes. The account for the 46 bales was then charged to the Rothschilds. Witness pointed out the entry in the books of \$260, being the commission charged Sigmund on the 45 bales, 5,207 pounds, sold to Gordon & Campbell. The invoice of the 46 bales showed that its weight was 5,275 pounds. The amount of commission charged on this transaction was \$2
