**Excerpts from Minutes of EBBA's
78th Annual Meeting
Held 20-22 April 2001
at Harford Glen Environmental Educa-
tion Center
Abingdon, Maryland**

***Theme: Bird Banding and Environmental
Education***

President's Report: President Gehret expressed appreciation for the opportunity of serving as president and reported we had a relatively uneventful year. Considerable effort has been expended by the net committee with help from Bob Yunick to secure a Japanese mist net supplier who could supply polyester nets in a quantity that we could afford to purchase. Alan expressed his appreciation to various members of his team for the fine jobs they are doing: Ken Heselton for organizing this year's meeting; Bob Pantle as EBBA editor and NABB production coordinator; and Brad Silfies as historian.

Memorial Grants: Alan Gehret reported that 12 excellent grant requests were received from which the following two \$500 grants were awarded: Mark Hauber, Cornell University, for his study "Social Experiences and Species Recognition in Brood Parasites"; Vincent Formica, Indiana State University, for his study "Territoriality in the White-throated Sparrow."

Mist Net Committee: Gale Smith reported that he has about \$32,000 worth of Japanese nylon nets for sale. He has been directed by Council to pursue the purchase of polyester nets and is hopeful of having these nets to sell within six to nine months.

Treasurer's Report: In the absence of Treasurer Don Mease, Alan Gehret reported that the Association's finances are in good condition.

Membership Report: In the absence of Elaine Mease, Alan Gehret reported that we added 28 new members in the past year and we currently have 464 members.

Editor's Report: Bob Pantle announced that there will be a page in each issue of the journal from the North American Banding Council, provided by Lucie Metras. He also noted that a recent issue of *NABB* has an article by Peter Pyle and Steve Howell revising the ageing and sexing key for Blue-throated Hummingbirds as it appears in Pyle's identification guide. This revision was published as a pull-out page to be inserted in the guide. He urged those who present a paper at EBBA's meetings to submit the paper for publication in *NABB*.

Student Travel Award: In the absence of Chairperson Roy Slack, Alan Gehret announced that a \$225 award was presented to Mark Hauber of Cornell University, who presented a paper at this meeting.

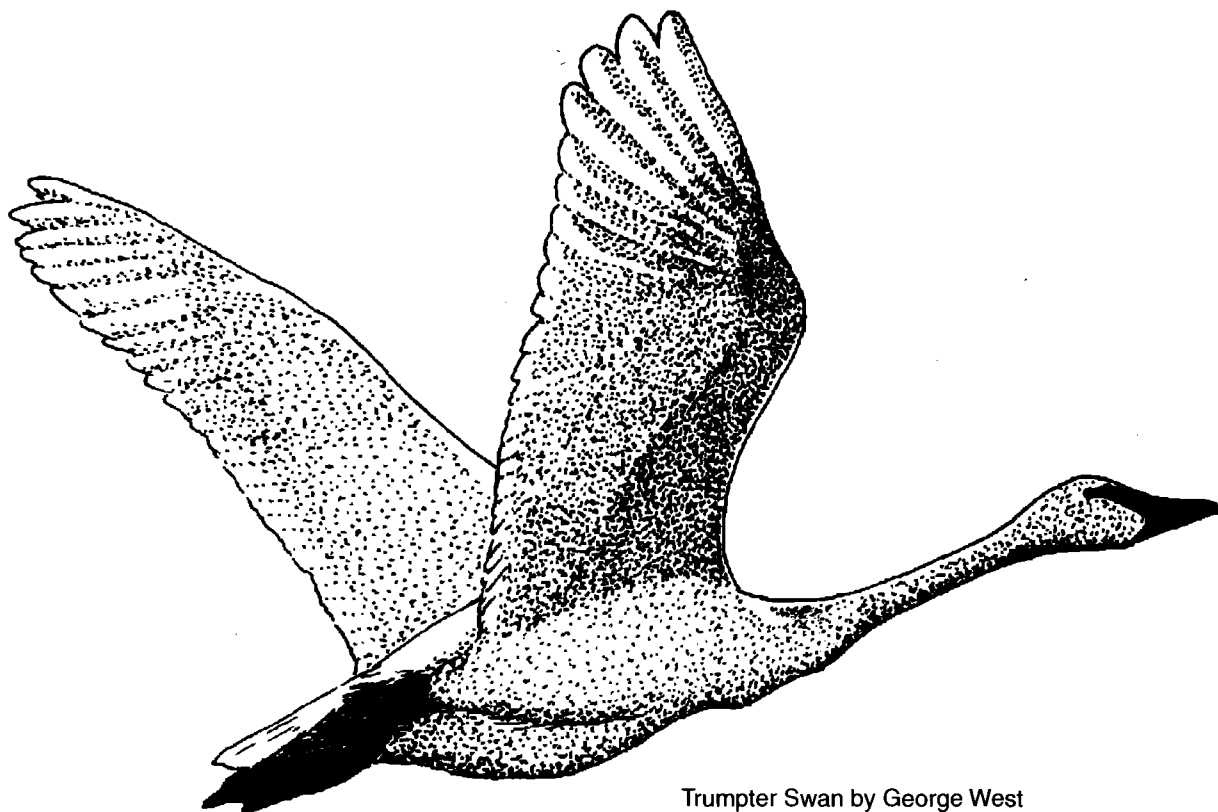
