**Excerpts from Minutes of  
EBBA's 80<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting  
Held 4-6 April 2003  
at the Powdermill Nature Reserve  
near Hidden Valley, PA  
"Expanding the World of Banding"**

**Second Vice President** - Ginger Bladen recommended the 2004 annual meeting be held 16-18 Apr at New London, CT.

**Third Vice President** - Betsy Brooks reported the acceptance of the budget and the proposal of three possible locations for the 2005 meeting: Long Point Ontario, Bowie, MD (near the Banding Lab) in conjunction with AFO and the Wilson Ornithological Society, and Braddock Bay, NY.

**Treasurer** - Don Mease reported the budget figures and indicated that the organization is sound. The financial report is available for any member who would like a copy.

**Editor** - Bob Pantle pointed out that the last issue of *NABB* (Vol.27, No. 4) contained no manuscripts, and put out a call for them. He indicated that editors and statisticians are available to assist authors. He also reported that the editors have the option to reject pre-published manuscripts.

**Publication Committee** - Elaine Mease reported that the membership is approximately 436, with 70 memberships still unpaid for the year. There has been a dues increase in the past year and new brochures have been printed. The website has been a help in recruiting new members.

**Memorial Grant Committee** - (Report by John Forness for Richard Roberts, chair, who resigned) The Memorial Grant Committee suggested two grants which were approved by council: "Age Related Hunting Tactics of the American Kestrel in Eastern Pennsylvania" by William Hobbs a PhD student at Rutgers University, and "Forest Fragmentation and Induced Edge Effect on Black-capped Chickadee" by Susan Guer, Department of Biology, Villanova University, Villanova, PA. These students each received a grant of \$500.

**Net Committee** - Gale Smith reported that some of the new nets had problems with knots coming undone and were sent back to Japan for repairs. Council voted to purchase more nets and agreed to have Gale eliminate some little-used net sizes and switch popular sized to polyester. He also reported that Spidertech nets will no longer be stocked. Net sales have shown a sizeable profit.

**NABC Delegate Report** - Mary Doscher attended a meeting in New Orleans, LA, last September and indicated the Banding Council is working on the shorebird manual and developing procedures for re-certification.
