banding nights). Although weather was not great, we managed to band owls each night. This also gave us time to do additional feeder banding during the days. A major movement of finches during those November weekends increased banding numbers significantly. By the end of 2004, we had banded a total of 15 days with 472.25 net hours, which is our highest effort to date.

Highlights of passerine banding were the addition of four species to our list of species banded on the island. This brings the total number of species banded on the island in nine years to 95. The new species were a Sharp-shinned Hawk, Yellow-billed Cuckoo, Willow Flycatcher, and Kentucky Warbler.

During the 2004 banding seasons, we banded 430 individuals of 37 species. Our birds banded per net hour rate was 0.91, which is below our nine-year average of 1.11 birds banded per net hour. The 430 individuals banded is our highest total and brings our total birds banded on Kelley's Island to 2,029. The banding of 234 American Goldfinch over three days in November had a great impact on banding numbers to say the least.

Owl banding showed much promise as we netted at least one owl each night of our attempt. On 13 Nov, we netted five owls. We banded four but the fifth was a recapture of an owl that had been banded 26 Oct 2003 in Stevens Point, WI. The only other significant recapture we had was of a

Black-capped Chickadee on 20 Nov. This individual had been banded by us on 18 Nov 2000 as a hatch-year individual.

The monthly census data produced 157 species for the year. This is slightly below average for the seven years of complete monthly censusing data, which is 159 species. Unusual species included a Red-necked Grebe in March, two Black Scoters in December, a Long-tailed Duck in December, an adult Northern Goshawk in December, six Rough-legged Hawks in January, an immature Little Gull in June, an adult California Gull in February, Thayer's Gull in February, three different Lesser Black-backed Gulls in February, March, and November, a Barred Owl in December, Tufted Titmouse in January, Kentucky Warbler in May, Clay-colored Sparrow in October, and "Oregon race" of Dark-eyed Junco in January and November.

## **IBBA Annual Report of Birds Banded, 2004**

Summary of banding reported from the IBBA region for 2004 with USFWS/CWS bands.

This is the third consecutive year of this report. Forty-five active banders reported banding 79,868 individuals of 308 species/forms. This represents more species/forms than have been reported previously and about 20,000 fewer birds being banded. In the past, Ohio banders have contributed 40% to the total number of bandings being reported; for this report Ohio banders report 25% of the total.

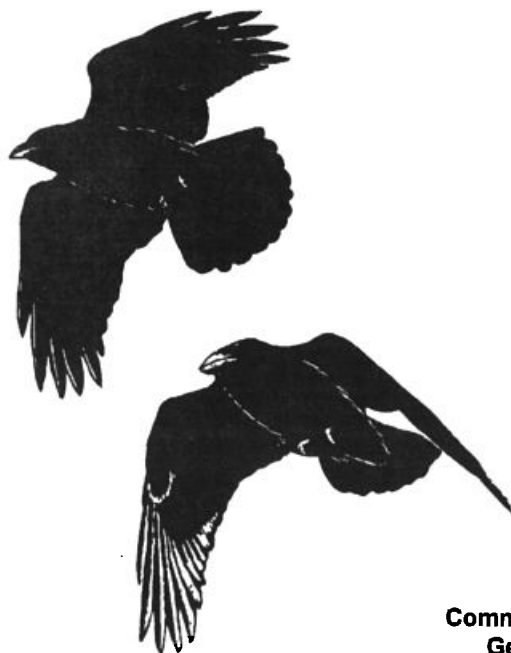
