1926 - 2006

Joe was a life member of the Eastern Bird Banding Association, the Brooks Bird Club, Virginia Society of Ornithology, Manomet Bird Observatory, and Inland Bird Banding Association. He had a regular membership in the Long Point Bird Observatory and the Ontario Bird Banding Association.

Joe held a master banding permit since the 1970s as well as a Pennsylvania State Permit issued by the Pennsylvania Game Commission. He banded birds for many years at Dolly Sods, Kiptopeke (on the Eastern Shore), and also visited Powdermill.
