NABC promotes competence in all aspects of banding, including bird capture, handling, identification, aging, sexing, banding, biometrics, research design, and data collection.

Did you know that the Bird Banding Offices recommend hard metal bands for use on some species? Hard metal bands can be more challenging to apply than aluminum bands. NABC and the Canadian Bird Banding Office have produced a short video on the use and application of hard metal bands. Bander Certification
