2009 (same day as the Warbling Vireo), recaptured on 24 May 2010, and again on 24 May 2011 (this banding and recaptures are most impressive since Red-eyed Vireos do nest at the sanctuary); and, finally, a female Common Yellowthroat (which may have nested at the sanctuary) initially banded on 15 Sep 2008, caught again on 2 Sep 2010 and now, again, on 12 May this year.

Notably absent from the nets this spring were: both cuckoos, Red-bellied Woodpecker, sapsucker, Yellow-throated and Philadelphia vireos, Blue Jay, White-breasted Nuthatch, Cedar Waxwing, Blue-winged, Golden-winged, and several other migrant warblers, Summer Tanager and Baltimore Oriole. And, if it had not been for one banding day there would have been only four Yellow-rumped Warblers captured, but 21 were banded on 30 Apr. IBBA Annual Report of Birds Banded, 2010

Summary of bird banding reported from the IBBA region for 2010.

This is the ninth consecutive year of this report. Sixty-six banders reported banding 113,000 birds and 357 species/forms. Illinois/Indiana, Kentucky/Tennessee, Arkansas/Oklahoma and Texas reported major increases in banding, while the Dakotas/Nebraska/Kansas reported much less. Texas banders reported 38% of banded birds, with Ohio reporting 25%, and Illinois/Indiana and Michigan/Minnesota/Wisconsin 13% each.

Ruby-throated Hummingbird was again the Number One species reported with 13,785 banded. This is both reflective of the abundance of the species and the strong interest in the banding community with this species. American Goldfinches increased in numbers this winter with 7676

reported. Inclusion of one game agency's dove banding placed White-winged Dove with 7380 as third and 2651 Mourning Doves as fifth. Black-chinned Hummingbird, being relatively abundant on the western end of the region, was reported as fourth with 5553. White-throated Sparrow was fifth with 3532, Purple Martin seventh with 2548, Chipping Sparrow eighth with 2544, Northern Cardinal ninth with 2304, and Gray Catbird tenth with 2103.
