Western Bird Banding Association Annual Meeting

Humboldt Bay Bird Observatory Arcata, California

18 to 21 September, 2014

Where will it be? HBBO is closely affiliated with the Klamath Bird Observatory and is situated beside an estuary within a National Wildlife Refuge. Near Arcata, home of Humboldt State University, it is in the mild, coastal climate of northwestern California. Nearby rivers, wetlands, and old-growth redwoods offer plenty of possibilities for birding trips and recreation.

What to Expect: The meeting is not to be missed. Along with informative scientific sessions there will be exciting demonstrations and workshops on a diverse array of bird research, banding, data management, and analysis of banding data. Workshops featuring data management, analysis tools, innovative banding equipment, and field trips to local hot spots and opportunities for walks and birding



around the diverse meeting site. The keynote speaker Dr. Jared Wolfe will feature his recent adventures on how international banding is changing the face of bird conservation, *"Bird Banding in the Country Least Known to Science: Adventures in Equatorial Guinea"*. Updates from banders in Mexico and Costa Rica will also be featured. Details for speakers and workshops will soon be finalized and announced on the WBBA website.

Setting and Meeting Location Details: Located at a long-running banding site that has operated nets and traps for more than 30 years, two stations one km apart will be operating in a riparian corridor amongst a coastal dune forest and pastures. World renowned for its outstanding scenic beauty, the redwood coast is well known the diversity of plant and animal life that provide the backdrop for the 2014 meeting. A total of 300 species have been recorded on the Observatory and the adjacent Lanphere Dunes Unit of the Humboldt Bay National Wildlife Refuge, which together encompass almost 1,000 acres of active sand dunes, dune forest, riparian, estuary, and pasture habitats.

Call for Papers, Posters, and Demonstrations (by 15 August). Paper and poster presentations can reflect original research, summarize existing information, or address the use of banding as a tool in avian research and monitoring. Please submit abstracts for papers or workshops electronically by 15 August to Linda Long (lllong "at" fs.fed.us), specifying workshop, paper, or poster. Late abstracts might not be accommodated. Field Trips: We have planned field trips to the nearby Humboldt Bay, the world-famous Arcata Marsh and Wildlife Sanctuary, old-growth redwood forests, and ponderosa pine mountainous forests, all within an hour of the Observatory. Indicate your interest in the registration form. We will rely upon carpooling for most trips; additionally, we may have a small van available at a modest cost.

Meals and food: We will have delicious buffet style meals catered from local redwood coast sources featuring organic and local foods, beer, and wine. Friday night will feature a traditional salmon bake, campfire, and live music by the Compost Mountain Boys.

NABC Evaluation Sessions. Trainer and bander evaluations will be held just after the meeting, beginning September 21. For more details, contact Kim Hollinger (krh "at" klamathbird.org).

Hotels: The Valley West Complex in Arcata is just 15 minutes from the Observatory (on Giuntoli and Janes Roads' intersection with US 101), and has several motels in a variety of price ranges. We have arranged for a discount at the very good Quality Inn Motel at 3535 Janes Road for a group room rate of \$99 per night double occupancy for attendees (contact information: 707 822-0409). Camping: Primitive camping is available on the pasture adjacent to the Observatory with parking, water, shower, and toilet facilities available.
