EASTERN BIRD BANDING ASSOCIATION ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES 23 June 2018

Meeting Convened:

The Annual meeting of the Eastern Bird Banding Association was held at Schoodic Institute, Winter Harbor, Maine. The Association meeting was called to order by President David Hauber at 1420.

Ken Hessleton moved that we dispense with reading the minutes of the last meeting. The motion was seconded by Adrienne Leppold and passed.

Officer's Reports:

President's Report David Hauber thanked all for coming and expressed great appreciation to 1st VP Adrienne Leppold for all her hard work organizing the meeting.

First Vice President:

Adrienne Leppold welcomed all and made special mention of her supervisor at Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, Brad Allen, for his support. She also reported that the meeting was expected to financially break even.

Second Vice President:

Andrea Patterson told the membership of her plan to host next year's meeting, 12-14 Apr, 2019, in Rochester, NY, with a theme of networking. Rochester is home to Braddock Bay Bird Observatory and the Braddock Bay Hawk Watch, and she hopes to take advantage of both during the meeting.

Third Vice President:

Treasurer:

Don Mease reported that the organization's finances are in good shape as our investments continue to perform well. Last year's income was \$15,777 and expenses were \$15,550, resulting in a surplus. The 2017 bucket raffle and silent auction raised \$2,386 which was used to support research grants.

Council resolved to have our editor move forward in the acceptance of manuscripts relating to telemetry as well as manuscripts originating in Central and South America (as long as the focal species spend part of their life cycle in North America).
