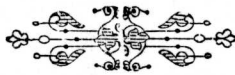

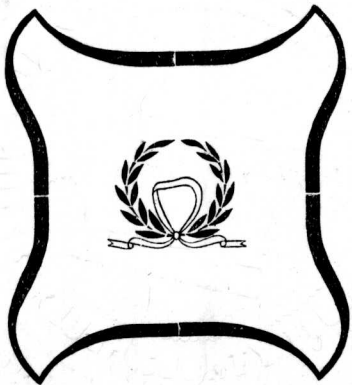
To any Minister of the Gospel or any Officer Legally Authorized to Solemnize the Rite of Matrimony:

Whereas, Application having been made to the County Judge of Hillsborough County, in the State of Florida, for LICENSE FOR MARRIAGE, and it appearing to the satisfaction of said County Judge that no legal impediments exist to the marriage now sought to be solemnized, these are, therefore, to authorize you to Unite in the

and that you make return of the same, duly certified, under your hand to the County Judge, aforesaid.
