More than 2.7 million (1 in 28) children in the United States currently have a parent who is in jail or prison. These children often face a lot of stress, including emotional, physical, academic, and financial hardships. Many



children choose not to talk about their stress because they worry that the stigma of having an incarcerated parent will make things worse.


