New Business

****MLK Day Parade.** College of Education faculty and staff have been invited to support the university's involvement in the January 18 Martin Luther King Day Parade. All faculty and staff are invited to gather at 10:00 AM in the Tropicana Field parking lot. Funds to purchase candy and/or candies to distribute during the parade are requested and should be delivered to Juanita Fountain. ****Action Item.**

MLK Day Leadership Awards Breakfast. The College of Education is continuing its on-going support for this important community event by purchasing a table.

SUS Deans Meeting. The deans of the colleges of education of the 11 SUS institutions in Florida met January 5 in Tampa. The agenda comprised three major areas: 1) letters of support requested by Commissioner of Education, Eric Smith, for the state's application for the Race to the Top; 2) draft white paper about the statewide leadership role of the SUS colleges of education in professional educator development, stakeholder partnerships for student achievement and teacher quality, and research; and 3) planning for the February 5 meeting with Chancellor Brogan of the BOG. The next meeting of the group is scheduled for January 22 in Tampa.

Enrollments and Strategic Initiatives. An analysis of the college's enrollments and admissions from Summer of 2008 to Spring 2010 shows four trends: 1) continued growth in undergraduate enrollments and admissions; 2) graduate enrollment and admission growth in the Dual Track, English Education, and the MAT in ESE; 3) decreased enrollments and admissions in Reading and Ed Leadership and flat enrollments in Math/Science; and 4) strong SCH production. Strategic Initiatives: 1) Ed Leadership is working with the Pasco County School District and the Pinellas County Schools to develop a new cohort of students for Fall 2010; 2) Dean Fueyo is requesting an extension from Progress Energy for tuition assistance funds to support this initiative; 3) Superintendent Janssen has offered to cover the tuition for a cohort of 20 elementary teachers for the Math/Science masters program; 4) Dean Fueyo's proposal to Progress Energy for the SunBay math initiative in digitally enhanced mathematics has been funded to support the PCS initiative to improve teaching of middle school mathematics. The proposal includes tuition assistance for 20 teachers; 5) Reading Education has been invited to offer a masters degree in Pasco County, which has strong enrollment growth; 6) College of Education support for advising and recruitment is being analyzed for cost effectiveness and impact.

Old Business.

Advertising College of Education Graduate Programs. Chancellor Sullivan purchased time for the College of Education to advertise its graduate programs on WUSF radio. The airing schedule occurred during the holiday break between December 20-23. There appeared to be no additional inquiries as a result of these radio announcements.

Career Ladder for Non-Tenure Track Faculty. The revised guidelines for a Career Ladder for Non-Tenure Track Faculty have been forwarded to Dr. Noonan for final feedback from the other academic deans and councils before being forwarded to the University Tenure and Promotion Committee.

**Community Board Service. As one of its many efforts to engage the university and the community, the Office of External Affairs is interested in increasing participation on community boards by faculty at USF St. Petersburg. To this end, it is developing an inventory of current faculty membership on community boards in St. Petersburg and Pinellas County.
