EXPANSION FACT SHEET

THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH FLORIDA AT ST. PETERSBURG

PHASE I -- PART I

GROUNDBREAKING: June 15, 1978

COMPLETION AND BUILDING OCCUPIED: December, 1980

COST: Exceeding \$8 million

ARCHITECTS: McLane Architectural Firm, Inc.;
Rados Partnership Architects, and
Carlos E. Alphonso & Associates, all of St. Petersburg, Florida

LOCATION: On 35 acres encircling Bayboro Harbor, located on the west side of St. Petersburg by the City and St. Petersburg. Adjacent to the 11-acre existing campus, acquired from U.S. Maritime Administration. The new planned City of St. Petersburg park and Department of Natural Resources building includes new Department of Natural Resources building construction.

EXTERIOR: Precast concrete panel which has exposed light white/tan color.

PHASE I -- PART I includes three buildings:

A. THE NELSON POYNTER MEMORIAL LIBRARY
34,870 sq. ft. in two stories @
Capacity for 120,000 volumes. Present holding
A portion of the second floor, looking across the harbor
has been designated as "Poynter Corner." This area is
related to the long career of Nelson Poynter, former president of
the Times Publishing Co., will be collected and preserved.
Includes three offices, two media rooms, a study
room, one service area.

B. BAYBORO HALL (Classroom/office/student services)
69,738 Sq. ft. in two floors 11 classrooms
20 classrooms 115 classrooms

STATUS OF EXISTING ST. PETERSBURG CAMPUS

Five older frame buildings:

BUILDING A: Former office/academic building now being used as marine science department and Florida State University. Renovations planned within the next few years. Estimated cost of \$4.6 million. This includes replacing entire mechanical systems for air conditioning, adding new laboratories and renovating old laboratories.

BUILDING B: Former student affairs and classrooms, being renovated in phases as other construction progresses. A portion of the wing will be demolished before construction of Part II begins in January, 1982.

BUILDING G: Former physical plant. Will be demolished.

BUILDINGS C AND F: On land leased to Florida Department of Natural Resources (New Department of Natural Resources Building, Ingle Building) is presently under construction. To be completed Summer, 1981.

FUTURE PROPOSED EXPANSION: PHASE I --

Proposed, awaiting funding approval by 1981 Florida Legislature.

COST: \$3.75 million

CONSTRUCTION EXPECTED TO BEGIN: January/February, 1982

COMPLETION EXPECTED: In 18 months, June/July, 1983

PHASE I -- PART II includes two buildings:

D. CLASSROOM/OFFICE/STUDENT SERVICES BUILDING
Approximately 30,000 sq. ft. in two stories
Joined to Bayboro Hall by a second floor walkway
Facing existing swimming pool
150-seat cafeteria with offices
Bookstore with offices

FUTURE PROPOSED EXPANSION: MARINE SC

Proposed, awaiting funding approval by 1981 Florida

COST: \$575,000

EXPECTED TO BEGIN CONSTRUCTION: January/February,

ANTICIPATED COMPLETION: In 12 months, January/February

ARCHITECT: Richard M. Jones, St. Petersburg

Shop space for repairing and renovating ships. Includes
metal and fiberglass shops, indoor and outdoor storage

FUTURE PROPOSED EXPANSION: PHASE II
USF-ST. PETERSBURG CAMPUS EXPANSION P

EXPECTED TO BE COMPLETED: By 1990

ESTIMATED COST:

PHASE II: Three buildings, including 50,000 sq. ft.
28,000 sq. ft. multi-use academic building
waterfront recreational building

PHASE III: Three buildings, 87,000 sq. ft. and 110
academic buildings and 50-70,000 sq. ft.

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
